**SUBJECT: ACCEPTANCE OF BID AND CONTRACT AWARD FOR THE POCKET ROAD  
RECONSTRUCTION AND RESURFACING PROJECT (PN:TR07)**

**LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:**

Pocket Road between Greenhaven Drive and Interstate 5. Council District 7.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

This report recommends that the City Council:

- Accept the bid of Vintage Paving in the amount of \$207,880; and
- Authorize the City Manager to execute a contract for the Pocket Road Reconstruction and Resurfacing Project (PN:TR07).

**SUMMARY:**

This project will construct roadway and frontage improvements on Pocket Road between Greenhaven Drive and Interstate 5. The improvements include constructing new asphalt

concrete pavement, curb, gutter, sidewalk, and drain inlets, reconstructing deteriorated pavement, placing an asphalt concrete overlay, and installing street lights.

The purpose of the project is to rehabilitate the roadway, connect existing segments of curb, gutter, and sidewalk, improve drainage, increase pedestrian safety, revitalize the neighborhood, and improve the overall aesthetics in the area.

The plans, specifications, and Negative Declaration for this project were approved by City Council on August 5, 1999. The Negative Declaration was filed with the County Clerk of the County of Sacramento on August 13, 1999. A Mitigation Reporting Program has been prepared to ensure compliance with the mitigation measures.

**COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:** None.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

- This project was authorized in the 1998/1999 Capital Improvement Program.
- This project was advertised and bids were received on July 28, 1999 and are summarized below:

- The construction estimate was \$185,500.
- Award to Vintage Paving is recommended.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

- The estimated total project cost, including all planning, design and construction, and construction engineering costs, is \$301,646.

- The project budget for the Pocket Road Reconstruction and Resurfacing Project is \$485,000.
- As of August 16, 1999, the unobligated Measure A Sales Tax Fund 201 balance is \$303,858 and the unobligated Major Streets Fund 209 balance is \$100,000. These funds are sufficient for award.

**ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

In accordance with the State Guidelines for implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) of 1970, the Planning Services Division, Environmental Section, has reviewed the proposed project. As a result, it was determined that the proposed project will not have any significant adverse impact on the environment and a Negative Declaration was prepared. The 30-day comment period has elapsed and no comments have been received. The Negative Declaration for this project was approved by City Council on August 5, 1999, and filed with the County Clerk.


**POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

The action requested herein is consistent with Sacramento City Code, Title 58.

**ESBD CONSIDERATIONS:**

To encourage small and emerging business participation, plans and specifications were sent to 8 plan rooms and construction service organizations for publication. All are directly involved with ESBE construction firms. Staff actively recruited available ESBE firms to participate in the bid process. Project notices were sent to 30 organizations involved in ESBE recruitment. The project was also announced on the Project Information Line and on the City's Internet site at [www.sacto.org/bids](http://www.sacto.org/bids).
