Secretary advised that the hourly rates for Painter and Painter Foreman have in the past been set according to rates outlined in contract between the Painters Union and the Painting and Decorating Contractors Association of Sacramento, and that a new contract has not been signed since the expiration of the old contract on June 30, 1962. In the interim period, individual contracts have been signed with various painting contractors, which provide for an increase of 20¢ per hour in the basic wage rate.

Secretary was instructed to obtain an opinion from the City Attorney as to the legality of any action by the Board to adopt wage rates outlined in these interim contracts for employees of the City of Sacramento in the classes of Painter and Painter Foreman.
