SUBJECT: Names for City Parks, Parkways, and Open Space Parcels

SUMMARY

This memorandum recommends official names for nine park sites, two parkways, and two open space parcels owned by the City of Sacramento.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City owns several unnamed developed and undeveloped parcels that were acquired for public park, parkway and open space purposes.

This memorandum identifies 13 sites that are recommended for official name designations by the City Council as follows:

A. Park Sites

1. George Washington Park (D-1). A 1.5-acre park adjacent to Washington School at 17th Street between E and F Streets, named for the first president of the United States.
2. J. Neely Johnson Park (D-1). A 1.5-acre park located adjacent to the J. Neely Johnson home at 11th Street between E and F Streets. This park is named for a former City attorney (1850) and former governor (1856-58) of the State of California.
3. Richard H. Marriott Park (D-8). A 6-acre park located on Grand River Drive in the South Pocket Community, named for a former mayor of the City.

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FINANCIAL DATA

There is no significant new cost associated with the name selections. Park signs for the existing improved sites are presently funded and there is no need to sign the unimproved sites.

RECOMMENDATION

4. Pollack Ranch Park (D-8). A 6.2-acre park located at Robin-ridge Way and Crownwest Way. The name is associated with the original Pollack Ranch. The park site was originally part of the Ranch land holdings and was the site of a ranch house which governed the northern portion of the Ranch.
5. Coloma Park (D-3). This 3-acre parcel and structural improve-ments is located at 4623 T Street and has been previously known as Elmhurst School and named for the succeeding Coloma School.
6. University Park (D-3). This 2-acre park site is located north of University Avenue and east of Howe Avenue and is named for the subdivision designation. Approximately 2 acres south of University Avenue is expected to be deeded to the City as part of this Park in the future.
7. Glenbrook Park (D-6). This 8.8-acre park site is located on La Riviera Drive and was previously designated as Glen-brook School Park. The new name indicates full City ownership.
8. Valley Vista Park (D-8). This 5.5-acre parcel is located at Valley Hi Drive and Monaghan Circle. The name indicates the location of the Park was a vista to Valley Hi Drive.
9. Camellia Park (D-6). This 2-acre park is located adjacent to Camellia Elementary School. The name is selected to be associated with Camellia School.

B. Parkways

1. Bannon Slough Parkway (D-1). All acreage abutting and part of the First Bannon Slough in the Natomas Community is named for the original Bannon Slough.
2. Pocket Canal Parkway (D-8). All acreage abutting and part of the canal system in the Pocket Community; named for the original Sacramento Pocket Community.

C. Open Space

1. Glenbrook Open Space (D-6). This 8.8-acre site is adjacent to Glenbrook Park on La Riviera Drive; named for the Glen-brook Park.
2. San Joaquin Open Space (D-6). This 9.4-acre site is located on San Joaquin Street and was previously known as the Muddox School property; named for the street location.

RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE OFFICIAL NAMES OF VARIOUS PARK SITES

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

1. The 1.56-acre park site abutting Washington School at 17th Street between E and F Streets is hereby designated as Washington Park.
2. The 1.48-acre park site at 11th Street between E and F Streets is hereby designated as J. Neely Johnson Park.
3. The 6-acre park site at Grand River Drive is hereby designated as Richard H. Marriott Park.
4. The 6.227-acre park at Robinridge Way and Crownwest Way is hereby designated as Pollack Ranch Park.
5. The 3.01-acre park site at 4623 T Street previously named Coloma School is hereby designated as Coloma Park.
6. The 2-acre park site immediately north of University Avenue and immediately east of Howe Avenue is hereby designated as University Park.
7. The 8.87-acre park and park site at La Riviera Drive and Waterglen Circle previously named Glenbrook School Park is hereby designated as Glenbrook Park.
8. The 5.5-acre park site at Valley Hi Drive and Monaghan Circle is hereby designated as Valley Vista Park.
9. The 2-acre park site abutting Camellia Elementary School is hereby designated as Camellia Park.
10. All acreage abutting and part of the First Bannon Slough in the Natomas Community is hereby designated as Bannon Slough Parkway.
11. All acreage abutting and part of the canal system in the Pocket Community is hereby designated as Pocket Canal Parkway.
12. The 8.87-acre site abutting Glenbrook Park at La Riviera Drive is hereby designated as Glenbrook Open Space.
13. The 9.4-acre site on San Joaquin Street previously known as Muddox School Property is hereby designated as San Joaquin Open Space.
