

MINUTES OF ARTS EDUCATION AND OUTREACH COMMITTEE MEETING
HELD ON OCTOBER 18, 1993

- I. **CALL TO ORDER:** At the hour of 4:10 p.m., the meeting was called to order.
- II. **APPROVED MINUTES:** Minutes of September 27, 1993 were approved after "project coordinator, open to other projects" was added to the Action Item topic of Alamo-Rent-A-Car Children's Art Project to formalize the relationship and work on the project for spring 1994.

III. **ACTION ITEM:** Editions to the mission statement were as follows:

- A. To advocate and foster (add the) participation of artists in basic education, the inclusion of an arts curriculum and quality teacher training in the arts for schools.
- C. To facilitate the collaboration between the artists' community, (add the) Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission, (delete other) public and private agencies, (delete and) the business community (add and those) that have not traditionally used the arts in developing programs that benefit school aged children.

Mission statement was unanimously approved with editions and will now go to Commission for approval.

IV. **DISCUSSION**

- 4a. Victoria passed out (2) invitations to each committee member to attend the evening show of Virgin-In-A-Sense. The dates were changed to October 26 through October 29. Public is impressed with the show. Victoria is meeting with UCD Med Center and speakers. Speakers change from day to day. Evening performance is basically for parents, teachers, Council, Committee members, Board of Supervisors, family and friends. Theater holds about 300 seats at the Mel Lawson Theater at Sacramento High.
- 4b. Project Status Report was passed out.
- 4c. Draft Budget of Alamo Rent-A-Car for coordination. A budget needs to be presented to committee to get their formal approval and then submitted to Alamo. V. Plata passed out a small draft of Alamo budget consisting of three components:
1. Coordinator - paid \$200 a month for two schools for about 10 hours of work.
 2. Frames
 3. Administration - \$100 a month.
- Total: \$6,075 for a year.

V. **OLD BUSINESS**

Cultural Resource Directory. Added 17 new artists. Need more Latino's, Asians, others. Next edition of Resource Directory will be in January. Visual Arts and Multi-Disciplinary are strongest components. Pleased with diversity in directory. A cover letter was sent out. Cover letter mentions Michelle as Director.

VI. **NEW BUSINESS**

Sierra North Arts Project meeting and information. Project is out of UC Davis - Crest Center. They work with teachers all over the county and northern California. Sierra North writes arts education workshops for teachers two weeks out of the summer. V. Plata is part of their advisory committee. Sierra North coordinates with the history, writing, and social studies project for the Crest Center and

develops curriculum. V. Plata went through some workshops where they combine 3 or 4 art disciplines together. This enables teachers to learn to use all the different art forms. Sierra North will be working with Metro Arts on planning teacher workshops for next year.

California Arts Education Conference in San Francisco Information.

CA Arts Education Conference in San Francisco will occur in November at the SF Art Institute. It was asked if Metro Arts had a list of agencies that offered teacher training workshops. For arts education workshops Metro has a list - Waldorf school, county and Sierra North. Can also take teacher training workshop classes at CSUS for credit. There is a real need for teacher training workshops. The arts education survey will help determine what is left in terms of arts in the teacher workshop area. Chevron is willing to give out money provided we can identify a project with continuity and not duplicated.
