SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF THE SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH OGILVY PUBLIC RELATIONS WORLDWIDE FOR CONTINUED SUPPORT OF THE WATER WISE PEST CONTROL PROJECT, A SACRAMENTO STORMWATER MANAGEMENT WATER QUALITY PROTECTION PROGRAM

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: Citywide

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the Supplemental Agreement increasing the contract with Ogilvy Public Relations Worldwide by \$63,800 and bringing the total for Contract No. 2002-060 to \$127,600 through June 30, 2003. Ogilvy Public Relations assists in the coordination and implementation of the Water Wise Pest Control program, a water quality protection effort of the Sacramento Stormwater Management Program, managed by the City's Department of Utilities.

SUMMARY:

The Water Wise Pest Control program is a joint effort between the Sacramento Stormwater Management agencies to reduce the amount of toxic pesticides entering local creeks and rivers through urban runoff and improper disposal. The City's Department of Utilities manages the program. Ogilvy Public Relations provides professional public outreach support and coordination for this water quality protection

program. Funds will be used to continue the current outreach efforts which includes expanding classroom outreach, developing new program materials, and expanding retail partnerships.

BACKGROUND:

The Water Wise Pest Control program is a result of a CalFed Grant received by the Sacramento Stormwater Permitees in 1999 to develop a program that would reduce the amount of toxic pesticides entering our local waterways. Since 1992, monitoring results had shown a steady increase in the amounts of pesticides found in urban creeks. After conducting a Request for Qualifications and Request for Proposals, the consulting firm of Deen and Black Pubic Relations, which is now a part of Ogilvy Public Relations Worldwide, was selected to assist with the development, design and implementation of the program. The result was the Water Wise Pest Control program. Through a partnership with the University of California Statewide Pesticide Integrated Pest Management Program, the University of California Cooperative Extension Master Gardener Program, the Sacramento Bee's Newspapers in Education program and partnerships with local nurseries, the Water Wise Pest Control program offers residents information on less toxic pest control methods and proper use, storage and disposal of pesticides. In October 2001, the program was selected to receive an award of excellence from the California Environmental Protection Agency's Department of Pesticide Regulation.

CalFed funding for the program ended in November 2001. The Sacramento Stormwater Management Program, consisting of the stormwater agencies of the County of Sacramento and the Cities of Sacramento, Galt, Folsom, and Citrus Heights now share the cost of continuing program efforts. The City continues to be the managing agency.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Sufficient funds have been budgeted for this project by the stormwater agencies involved in the Sacramento Stormwater Management program. The City's portion would be 34% (\$21,692) of the \$63,800 Supplemental Agreement.

However, because of their initial involvement in the program design, development and implementation, they are uniquely qualified to continue to provide public relations assistance on the Water Wise Pest Control program.


