



SUBJECT: Ordinance Amending Chapter 11 of the Sacramento City Code Relating to

City Cemetery Services

## SUMMARY

This item is presented at this time for approval of publication of title pursuant to City Charter, Section 38.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Chapter 11 of the Sacramento City Code relates to the provision of City Cemetery services. Currently, the Chapter provides for fees to be paid to the City for opening and filling graves, a service the City has not provided since March 1982. The proposed amendment would replace reference to this obsolete service, with provisions for payment of an administrative fee to offset costs incurred by City supervision of burials. Further, the proposed change would add a requirement that private gardeners working on cemetery plots register at the cemetery office to prevent conflicting maintenance between the City and private caretakers.

#### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that this item be passed for publication and continued to March 12, 1985.

## SECTION 1.

Section 11.2 of the Sacramento City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 11.2 Entering Cemetery Grounds; Loitering

No person shall enter the city cemetery grounds between 4:30 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. of the following day, unless specifically authorized to do so by the Director of Parks and Community Services or his designee.

No person shall loiter in any cemetery or property used or held exclusively for the burial or other permanent deposit of the human dead. For the purposes of this section, loitering shall mean and include entering and remaining in any cemetery under such circumstances that a reasonable person would conclude that the person who has entered and remains does not have a purpose legitimately connected with the cemetery, and is causing public inconvenience or annoyance.

### SECTION 2.

Section 11.3 of the Sacramento City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 11.3 Depositing Rubbish and Maintenance of Plots

It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit rubbish, grass clippings, shrub cuttings or other similar materials or substances within the confines of the city cemetery, without the written permission of the Director of Parks and Community Services. This prohibition does not apply to placing cut flowers upon a grave site. (Ord. 3059, §1; Ord. 3864, §1).

Any private gardener or other person providing care to private plots within the confines of the City cemetery shall register with the City cemetery staff a list of plots for which he or she provides the care and shall provide a monthly update of that list.

Section 11.4 of the Sacramento City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 11.4 Administrative Service Fee.

An administrative service fee shall be charged for each burial in the city cemetery. The amount of the fee shall be established by resolution by the City Council.

## ORDINANCE NO. 8

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Section 11.4 of the Sacramento City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 11.4 Fees for Excavation and Filling of Graves. Administrative Service Fee.

Fees for opening, excavating and filling of graves in the cemeteries owned by the City shall be established by resolution by the City Council. An administrative service fee shall be charged for each burial in the city cemetery. The amount of the fee shall be established by resolution of the City Council.

## SECTION 4.

Section 11,5 of the Sacramento City Code is hereby repealed.

Section 11.5 Sinking and Lowering of Remains.

For the sinking or lowering of remains already interred, a fee established by resolution of the city council shall be paid, which fee shall be in addition to the schedule for the opening, excavating and filling of graves provided in the preceding section.

## SECTION 5.

Section 11.6 of the Sacramento City Code is hereby renumbered as Section 11.5.

SUBJECT: City Cemetery Services and Fees

## SUMMARY

The current Cemetery Ordinance, City Code Chapter 11, provides for fees to be paid to the City for opening and filling graves. For economy in staffing, the City no longer provides this burial service and instead, has the undertakers arrange for a private contractual service. The City does, however, still provide administrative supervision of the burials. It is recommended that the Council approve the attached ordinance changes reflecting this procedural change and adding a requirement that private gardeners working on cemetery plots register at the cemetery office.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

City Code Section 11.4 provides fees for excavation and filling of graves and Section 11.5 provides fees for sinking and lowering of remains. In past years, the City maintained a larger staff at the cemetery for hand mowing of weeds and aisleways and staff were available for burial services. In recent years, staffing has been reduced and the weed control is provided by chemical spraying. Due to the small number of burials, approximately six per year, staffing for burial purposes is not warranted. Burial services by City staff have not been provided since March 1982.

Since March 1982, the undertakers and funeral homes have made private arrangements for the opening and closing of the graves and the City provides the related administrative services. These services include locating the grave, supervising and inspecting the burial, processing related documents and records, and disposition of flowers. This arrangement has worked out quite successfully.

Staff proposes a change in the Cemetery Ordinance to reflect this new practice as well as a change in the fees resolution to provide for an administrative fee of \$100 per burial which is the cost the City incurs for providing said services.

The third element of the proposed ordinance change relates to maintenance of the plots. The City owns the aisles, roads and veterans plots, while the individual plots are privately owned. The City also provides minimal grounds maintenance of the public property while maintenance of the private plots is the responsibility of the heirs. Accordingly, some are well tended by private gardeners while others receive minimal or no private care. Plots receiving no private care are cleared of weeds by the City.

To avoid conflicting maintenance between the City and private caretakers, the proposed ordinance requires persons caring for private plots to provide a list of plots in their care to the City Cemetery office.

## FINANCIAL DATA

Revenue generated by this activity, estimated at \$600 annually, would be deposited in the General Fund to offset City costs.

## RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council enact the attached ordinance amending Chapter 11 of the Sacramento City Code. Further, it is recommended that the City Council approve, by resolution, an amendment to the cemetery related fee structure.
