The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at 4 o'clock P. M. in the office of the City Manager in the City Hall, Vice President Mason presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Chenu, Mason.  
ABSENT: Commissioner Nathan.

City Manager H.C. Bottorff also was present by invitation.

Due to absence of President Nathan it was decided by the Board to postpone interview with committees from the Police and Fire departments relative to wage scale increases.

H. E. Kneeland appeared before the Board relative to his Civil Service status as stationary engineer and stationary fireman, and also concerning his continuity of service with the City of Sacramento.

After full consideration of these subjects and reviewing the records, the Board arrived at the conclusion that Mr. Kneeland had no existing civil service rights either as stationary fireman or engineer, and that the subject of continuous service and eligibility for pension under the provisions of the Charter would have to be determined upon completion of twenty years continuous service and compliance with other requirements of the Charter. The Secretary was instructed to transmit a copy of these findings to the City Manager.

Adjournment was taken at 5.20 o'clock P. M. to meet again at the call of the Chair.
