

# RESOLUTION NO. 731

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

August 12, 1937.

WHEREAS, there has just been completed two overhead water storage tanks for the City of Sacramento, said tanks being the largest of their type in the world, and

WHEREAS, the purposes of said tanks are to equalize the water pressure throughout the City of Sacramento, to make more efficient the water supply for fire protection within said City of Sacramento, and to reduce the cost of operating the water system of said City of Sacramento, all for the best interest of the people of our City, and

WHEREAS, IT is proper and fitting that the people of the City of Sacramento become better informed as to the important relationship that said tanks bear to the proper protection of the health and safety of our citizens, as well as to the protection of their property.


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a day be set aside at which time the proper persons shall be present at said tanks to display same and explain the operation thereof to the general public of the City of Sacramento, and that at said time all persons interested be invited to attend and view said tanks, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this council record itself as complimenting the Campbell Construction Company, a local firm, upon the efficient manner in which said firm carried to completion the matter of the construction of said tanks.
