

MINUTES OF THE ARTS EDUCATION AND OUTREACH COMMITTEE
HELD ON JANUARY 23, 1995

I. CALL TO ORDER:

At the hour of 4:10 pm the meeting was called to order.

II. MINUTES APPROVED:

The minutes of November 17, 1994 were approved. Motion made by Sandra Yee for approval, Moved by Wayne Cook, seconded by with a change of the date on minutes, seconded by Terry Givens.

III. DISCUSSION:

A. Program updates for the Artists in the Schools by Victoria. This is a short term artist in residency program for fifth grade students in 30 schools with a timeline as follows: Jan.10, applications available. Jan. 27, letters of intent due from schools. Feb. 5, artist applications due. Feb. 15, artist and schools notified of position. Feb. 21-24, artist visit chosen schools. Mar.4, teacher and artist workshop. Mar.13, program starts and runs for 8 weeks (1 session per week), Victoria will visit the schools throughout the county. Commitment of schools are the space availability and half the cost of the residency (\$180.00). Our goal is to reach 30 schools. There also be a fall session. The funding comes from the general budget. A spring application has been sent out for artists for the spring interviews. Scores and ranking from the winter interviews were discussed. Artists reviewed and ranked by tallies from the selection committee. Two artists were recommended for technical assistance and one was not accepted for the Cultural Resource Directory. Artists selected will be for both AIS programs, CRD and Neighborhood Art Programs.

B. Sacramento Youth Commission Representative:

Guest was introduced from the Sacramento Youth Commission, Ramiro Jimenez from the Neighborhood Services Dept. Briefly explained the function of the Youth Commission and 11 member panel composed of youth from the 8 different council districts. There is a future possibility that we will add a youth member to our committee.

C. Status Report on the Artist Interviews:

Breakdown of the artists that applied and were interviewed was reported by Alpha. 200 applications were mailed out, no general press release, applications were available on a walk-in basis. 35 applicants responded, 2 no shows at interviews and 3 that did not complete applications. 28 were

interviewed but two were not eligible for application for programs because they do not live in Sacramento County, but are eligible for the CRD due to serving the residents of Sacramento Co. Interest in the AIS program were by 25 artists, 27 in the CRD, 27 in the NAP, and 10 in the Slide Bank. 12 male artists applied and 16 female artists applied. The artist are from the council districts as listed, with the map in the packet provided We have artists from every supervisorial districts. This information is important for the meetings that the commissioners have with the city and county officials. (Updated maps provided in packet.)

Recommendation from chair to do this type of survey for all programs especially Alamo Student Art Gallery Program. Our served population is all the children who participate not only those who exhibit.

D. Internship Program:

Alpha reviewed the internship program. Applications are available to different colleges and universities in the area. Press releases and flyers have gone out. An ad has been placed in the Sacramento Bee.

IV. New Business:

Chair of the Commission, Sandra Yee announced her resignation as the chair of the AEO Committee, Commissioner Tony Marquez will be the new chair and Commissioner Dennis Yep will be a new committee member.

Mural and Aerosol Art Summit will take place April 8, 1995 and call was made for volunteers from the committee.

Planning is underway with Mather Air Force Base for possible partnership involving the Arts Commission in their future projects.

V. PUBLIC DISCUSSION:

Mr. Ramiro Jimenez of the Sacramento Youth Commission introduced the committee to the duties of the Youth Commission. He put forth the idea of possibly having a Youth Commissioner on our committee. They are interested in the mural projects and getting involved in the Mural Summit.
