Reginald Young, Deputy Director of Public Works, gave an overview of the proposed pilot recycling program. He informed the committee that the proposed program had been reviewed by the labor organizations and they had no objections. Chair Robie recommended that the Sacramento Local Conservation Corps (SLCC) consider implementing the program in South Land Park, Land Park and Greenhaven, even if this involved additional costs.

Gary Van Dorst, SLCC, told the Committee he would be happy to work with them to identify appropriate neighborhoods.

Kelly Smith, Research Director for Californians Against Waste, testified that he was concerned that the pilot program would only be a token effort. He recommended that the City Council study city-wide programs, including recycling and composting.

It was moved by Committee member Shore and seconded by Committee member Kastanis to approve staff recommendation.

MINUTES:

Bob Wall, Acting Director of Planning and Development, explained that the City is required to adopt the amended floodplain management ordinances before February 4, 1988, in order to continue participation in the National Flood Insurance Program. Terry Paxton, Supervising Engineer, explained that the major change in the ordinance dealt with the definition of manufactured housing, but that the building requirements are the same.

Committee member Kastanis requested that the Building Industry Association (BIA) be notified when the item is scheduled for full Council.

In response to a question from Chair Robie, Tim Sullivan, Superintendent of Building Inspections, explained that three additional staff members will be required to implement the floodplain management ordinances.

It was moved by Committee member Shore and seconded by Committee member Kastanis to approve staff recommendation.
