**SUBJECT: AN EXTENSION & MODIFICATION OF AN EXISTING ORDINANCE (98-049)
PROHIBITING NEW SOLIDWASTE TRANSFER OR PROCESSING STATIONS
(M00-011)**

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: Bounded by the American River on the north and the
City limits on the south, east and west. (City-wide)

RECOMMENDATION: Amend the Ordinance to extend the expiration date on the prohibition
of acceptance or processing of applications for certain solid waste transfer or processing
facilities and to modify the boundary of the moratorium area.

SUMMARY:

The proposed amendments would extend the prohibition on processing applications or other discretionary development entitlements for solid waste transfer or processing facilities that handle municipal solid waste and yard waste composting facilities and modify the boundary for the moratorium area, to all areas south of the American River within the City limits as shown on the attached exhibit. Staff is conducting a Citywide Solid Waste Facility Distribution Study that will replace the temporary prohibition Ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On November 10, 1998, the City Council adopted Ordinance 98-049 which established a temporary prohibition on accepting or processing applications for major solid waste transfer or processing facilities until new policies were in place regarding the size and spacing of such
