

RESOLUTION ORDERING WORK #2126.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sacramento did on the 30th day of September, 1926, pass its Resolution of Intention No. 2126, declaring its intention to order the following work and improvement to be done, to-wit:

The opening of a new street to be eighty (80) feet in width and to be known as "Land Park Drive" from the northerly boundary of William Land Park to the northerly boundary of the property now or formerly owned by M. A. K. Landsburg, a distance of 1431 feet, more or less, the center line of which will be twenty feet westerly from the center line of 15th Street, in the City of Sacramento, if the same were produced southerly from Y Street, and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Streets of said City did thereupon cause notice of the passage of said Resolution to be posted and published for ten days in the manner and as required by law, and


WHEREAS, no objections have been filed against said proposed work and improvement, and more than ten days have elapsed after the expiration of the time of the publication of said notice of the passage of said Resolution, and the said City Council has acquired jurisdiction to order said work as proposed in said Resolution to be done;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that said work and improvement be done as aforesaid and as specifically described in said Resolution of Intention No. 2126, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that D. K. Colclough, Edward P. Bell and A. J. Delano are hereby appointed Commissioners to assess benefits and damages and to have general supervision

of said proposed work and improvements until the completion thereof in compliance with law.
