ORDINANCE NO. _____ FOURTH SERIES.

"An Ordinance granting to Sacramento Northern Railroad, a Corporation, its successors and assigns, for the term ending May 29th, 1959, the right to lay down, operate, construct, and maintain standard gauge railroad tracks on 11th and 12th Streets, between H and I Streets, in the City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of California, said tracks to constitute connecting tracks between the present tracks on I Street, over which the trains and cars of said Sacramento Northern Railroad are now operated, and the yard tracks of the Union Electric Railroad passenger station to be located on the North 1/2 of the block bounded by 11th, 12th, H and I Streets in said City, the center line tangent of the track on said 12th Street to be a single track stem located on the center line of said street, which said stem track on said 12th Street is to be connected by curves around the northeast and northwest corners of the intersection of said 12th and I Streets with the present double tracks on I Street, over which the trains and cars of said Sacramento Northern Railroad are now operated and which said stem track on said 12th Street is also to be connected by curves with four parallel yard tracks to be constructed on the said north 1/2 of the block bounded by 11th, 12th, H and I Streets, the center line tangent of the northerly track of the said four yard tracks to coincide with A line which is 4' south of and parallel to the south line of H Street, between 11th and 12th Streets, and which said three other yard tracks are to be laid southerly from and parallel to said northerly yard track, and the center line tangent of the track on 11th Street to be a single track stem located on the center line of said street, and which said track stem on 11th Street is to be connected, by curves, around the northwest and northeast corners of the intersection of 11th and I Streets, with the said existing double track on I Street and which said stem track on 11th Street is also to be connected, by curves, with the aforesaid four parallel yard tracks: also the right to run and operate trains and cars propelled by electricity or any motive power, except steam, for the transportation of passengers, baggage, mail and express matter for hire, over all of said tracks above referred to or described, and providing certain conditions relative to the establishment of said tracks and the operation of trains and cars thereon, and providing for the cancellation of this ordinance for the violation of any of said conditions."

Moved by Councilman Funke, Seconded by Councilman Anderson that foregoing Ordinance be adopted, and carried by following vote:

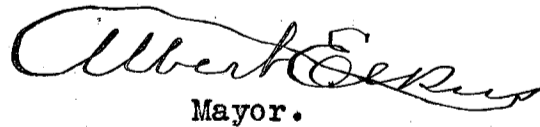
