



**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO
SUPPORTING STATE PROPOSITION 25 THE CALIFORNIA VOTERS BILL OF
RIGHTS ACT ON THE MARCH 7, 2000 BALLOT**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sacramento discussed the State Proposition 25 on the March 7, 2000 election, and

WHEREAS, Proposition 25, the California Voters Bill of Rights Act, deals with election campaigns, contributions and spending limits, and public financing disclosures, and

WHEREAS, Proposition 25 provides for public financing of candidates, ballot measure campaign costs, disclosure of top contributors, fund-raising time restrictions, establishes contribution and spending limits, and bans corporate contributions, and

WHEREAS, Proposition 25 establishes contribution limits for local elective office of \$3,000 per election for individuals and political action committees, and

WHEREAS, Proposition 25 limits political parties to giving not more than 25% of voluntary spending limits established by this proposition, and

WHEREAS, Proposition 25 prohibits transfers of contributions from one campaign committee to another campaign committee,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Sacramento hereby supports the passage of California State Proposition 25.
