HEREBY CALL Special Meetings of the Sacramento City Council, Redevelopment Agency of the City of Sacramento, Housing Authority of the City of Sacramento, and Parking Authority of the City of Sacramento to be conducted concurrently with the Council committee meetings listed below, which are incorporated herein by reference. The Special Meetings are called to permit Members who are not on the listed committees to attend the meetings and participate in the discussions. In the event five (5) or more members of the City Council are present at a Committee meeting, only those items listed on the agenda can be acted on or discussed.

The meeting was called to order at 4:14 p.m. by Chairman Terry Kastanis.

PRESENT: Committeemembers Kastanis, Robie and Shore.*

ABSENT: Committeemember Pope.

*Committeemember Shore arrived at 4:22 p.m.

1. Ordinance adding Article XV to Chapter 25 of the Sacramento City Code relating to residential automotive repair and maintenance.

RECOMMENDATION OF STAFF: RECOMMEND APPROVAL AND FORWARD TO COUNCIL.

COMMITTEE ACTION: CONTINUED TO AUGUST 24, 1989.

MINUTES:

Tom Long, Assistant Nuisance Abatement Manager, explained to the Committee that this ordinance was being restructured upon the advice of the City Attorney's office, and that he would like to bring it before the Committee at the August 24, 1989 meeting. Mr. Long briefly described this ordinance to the Committee.

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2. Resolution supporting HR 2265 (Matsui) to enact the Public Transit and Van Pool Ridership Equity Act of 1989.

Jim Bloodgood, Supervising Engineer, was present to discuss this resolution. He explained that this increases the amount of tax-free subsidies employers can give to employees.

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3. AB 933 (Chacon, et al.) relating to a 1990 Census Awareness Program.

RECOMMENDATION OF STAFF: RECOMMEND SUPPORT.

MINUTES:

Diane Balter, Deputy City Attorney, presented this item to the Committee. She explained that the Mayor had requested support of this bill some time ago, and that this bill is intended to make people aware of the Census who would otherwise not know of it and not be counted. Kastanis stated that the Mayor has since requested we not support this legislation, since the Mayor has recently set up various interest groups who are working with the Census on a voluntary basis, and the City should not spend a lot of money to obtain the same results that are already being attained on a voluntary basis. was concerned as to how persons without addresses would be able to be contacted by mail, which is what this bill suggests doing, and Robie said she doesn't want to support this bill for that reason. Kastanis suggested the Committee either oppose this bill or take no action. Robie suggested the Committee oppose the bill but write a letter saying we are very supportive, but that the City of Sacramento has started its own program which the Committee feels will be much more effective than this bill, and that we are going to get this done.

Robie moved to oppose AB 933 relating to a 1990 Census Awareness Program and to have Diane Balter write a letter to Assemblyman Chacon as detailed above. Kastanis seconded the motion. Shore abstained, as he arrived late and did not hear the full discussion regarding this issue.

4. SB 734 (Davis) regarding juvenile wards.

RECOMMENDATION OF STAFF: RECOMMEND SUPPORT.

MINUTES:

Diane Balter, Deputy City Attorney, was present to discuss this item. Robie stated that she would like to see this bill expanded to cover all community care facilities, rather than just using the word "juvenile." She said that in board and care homes can be found both juveniles and adults. Attorney Balter explained that this bill died this year, but will be brought up again next year. She said that it has been having a very difficult time and that the City would be very lucky to get just this limited bill passed. Robie suggested we support it but write and say that we would like to see this

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legislation expanded. Shore suggested that the Committee ask Ken Emanuels, the City's Legislative Advocate, to have one of our local legislators co-sponsor this bill and show support. Robie moved to support SB 734 regarding juvenile wards. Kastanis seconded the motion and it was unanimously supported.

5. SB 737 (Marks) relating to centralized certification for Women and Minority Business Enterprises.

RECOMMENDATION OF STAFF: RECOMMEND OPPOSITION.

COMMITTEE ACTION: OPPOSED.



MINUTES:

Shore moved to oppose SB 737. Robie seconded the motion and it was unanimously opposed. Robbin Randolph, Purchasing Manager of General Services, explained that if this bill is passed, the City would lose local control. She said this bill will be reintroduced in January of 1990.

Chairman Kastanis announced that the meeting next month will be held on Thursday, August 24th. The meeting was adjourned at 4:30 p.m.
