

SPECIAL MEETING
SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL
November 13, 1963

The Honorable City Council met in Special Session on this date at the hour of 8:35 o'clock P. M. , Mayor McKinney presiding and roll call was answered as follows:

PRESENT: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Mering, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

ABSENT: Councilman Murphy.

Executed copies of the Call of the meeting issued by the Mayor and presented by the City Clerk were ordered filed.

The Call stated the purpose of the meeting to be that of receiving report from the Core Area Committee on ways and means to implement the Community and Cultural Centers Project and to present such other matters as may regularly come before said body or be presented by the City Manager.

Upon the verbal recommendation of the City Manager, Councilman Domich moved that Councilman Murphy be authorized to represent the City at the Auburn Dam-Folsom South Canal Senate Hearings in Washington, D. C. 4415

Seconded by Councilman Christensen and carried by the following vote:

AYES: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Mering, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

ABSENT: Councilman Murphy.

Mr. Herb Silvius, Chairman of the Citizens' Core Area Advisory Committee, appeared and on behalf of the Sub-Committee of the Citizens' Core Area Advisory Committee, presented a report relating to a study of ways and means to implement the Community and Cultural Centers Project in the City of Sacramento.

Councilman Murphy arrived at this time.

The report was discussed in detail and ordered placed on file.

Following a discussion of the possibility of supporting the project by means of a Hotel Room Tax, the Citizens' Core Area Sub-Committee was asked to continue its studies of the proposed project and to pursue the feasibility of obtaining revenues from a Hotel Room Tax ordinance to assist in the financing of the proposed Community and Cultural Centers Project.

Councilman Nielsen thereupon moved that the report, as presented, be approved and the Committee encouraged to continue the study of the project. 4416

Seconded by Councilman Christensen and carried by the following vote:

AYES: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Mering, Murphy, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

During discussion of the foregoing report it was suggested that the name "Core Area Advisory Committee" be changed to "Community Improvement Committee".

City Manager Cavanaugh suggested that a citizens' committee be formed to advise the public on various possible bond issues, such as drainage bonds, etc.

Council adjourned at the hour of 9:30 o'clock A. M.
