**SUBJECT:** ACCEPTANCE OF THE GANG VIOLENCE SUPPRESSION GRANT FROM  
THE OFFICE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PLANNING (OCJP)

**LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:**

City Council Districts 7 & 8; Luther Burbank High School area

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt the attached Resolution which includes the acceptance of the Gang Violence Suppression grant award of \$107,468 from OCJP, the augmentation of the Police Department's grant operating budget, and the authorization to increase the Police Department's staffing level by 1.0 FTE Police Officer.

**SUMMARY:**

The City of Sacramento and the Sacramento Police Department have been awarded a Gang Violence Suppression Grant from the Office of Criminal Justice Planning. The grant will provide gang suppression services for the Luther Burbank High School and its surrounding area. The total grant award is \$107,468 of which \$96,721 is funded by the grant. A 10 percent match of \$10,747 is required. The grant period is for one year, with the possibility of second and third year funding.

**COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:**

No Committee/Commission Action is required for this report.

**BACKGROUND:**

On June 24, 1998, the Police Department received the Gang Violence Suppression Grant award approval from OCJP. The purpose of the grant is to establish a multi-component approach to focus on gang violence in the Luther Burbank High School area, Thurgood Marshall Alternative High School, and Education Clinics, Inc.

As a result of a previous OCJP grant, gang activity has decreased in the target area. However, school officials indicate there are many gangs and gang members still present on school campuses. Their presence affects the learning atmosphere and safety of all students.

The Police Department will work in partnership with the Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento District Attorney's Office, Sacramento City Unified School District, and three Community Based Organizations (CBOs) - LaFamilia Counseling Center, Inc., Asian Resources, Inc., and Another Choice, Another Chance. The combined grant award for all components, including the Police Department's share, is \$500,000. The Sacramento Local Coordinating Committee (LCC), formed in April 1998, will act as the primary coordinating mechanism for grant implementation. All participating agencies are part of the LCC.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

The grant award for the Police Department is \$107,468. OCJP will fund 90 percent of the grant, totaling \$96,721. The remaining 10 percent totaling \$10,747 is required to be provided by the City as matching funds. The Police Department has funds within its existing operating budget to cover the required match. No additional funds are requested from the City.

The grant is for one year, with possible second and third year funding. A 20 percent match will be required for the second year, and a 30 percent match for the third year.

**ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

This report does not involve an activity which would be covered by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).


**POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD OF \$96,721 FROM THE OFFICE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PLANNING, TO IMPLEMENT THE GANG VIOLENCE SUPPRESSION GRANT

WHEREAS the City of Sacramento desires to undertake a certain project designated the Gang Violence Suppression Grant, to be funded in part from funds made available through the Gang Violence Suppression Program administered by the Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Sacramento that:

1. The City Manager, or a designated representative, is hereby authorized to execute a grant award on behalf of the City of Sacramento, from OCJP in the amount of \$107,468, including any extensions or amendments thereof, to provide gang violence suppression services.
2. The Police Department has identified funds within its existing operating budget to provide the required match of \$10,747.
3. The Police Department's staffing level be increased by one (1.0 FTE) Police Officer.
4. The Grant Operating Budget be increased by:

7. It is agreed that any liability arising out of the performance of this Grant Award Agreement, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility of the grant recipient and the authorizing agency. The State of California and OCJP disclaim responsibility for any such liability.
8. Be it further resolved that grant funds received shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.
