

ORDINANCE NO. 1503, FOURTH SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO PURCHASE TRAFFIC SIGNS AND TRAFFIC SIGNALS IN THE OPEN MARKET WITHOUT ADVERTISING FOR BIDS, PURSUANT TO SECTION 251 OF THE CITY CHARTER, AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1: That the City Manager is hereby authorized to purchase in the open market, without advertising for bids, pursuant to Section 251 of the City Charter, TRAFFIC SIGNS AND SIGNALS. The cost of said Traffic Signs and Signals not to exceed the sum of \$5600.00.

SECTION 2: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately; such emergency being the necessity of putting the Comprehensive One-way Street Plan into operation as enacted by the Council under date of May 18, 1950, Ordinance No. 1504, Fourth Series, which measure was an emergency measure to put this plan into effect as soon as possible. That to take the time to draw specifications and call for bids would cause an unnecessary delay.
