

Sacramento, California.
April 18, 1929.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at 7:10 o'clock P.M. in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, President Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Weisman and Chenu.
ABSENT : Commissioner Mason.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with. The Board proceeded to review the examination papers for Watchman. Upon motion by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Chenu, and unanimously carried, the Board decided that any answer except answer No. 2 to Question 1, Test 1, should be marked correct. The Board then established the weighted average for this examination as follows:

Written Test 8, Oral Test 2, total 10.

The examination papers for Machinist was next reviewed by the Board. Upon a careful examination of this test, the Board ordered the following corrections made to the answer stencil:

Question 10, Test 1, correct answer is either double thread or stud.

Question 36, Test 1, correct answer is either couplings or sleeves.

Question 41, Test 1, is either shaping or drop forging.

Question 42, Test 1, is either cotter or drift pin.

Question 46, Test 1, is either hobs or master taps.

Question 7, Section B, is either fly wheel or governor.

Question 12, Section B, is either flatening or finishing.

Question 15, Section B, was referred to the City Electrician. City Electrician advised that stencil answer was correct; namely, Only the starter switch should be released.

Question 19, Section B, any of the four answers are correct.

Question 21, Section B, either two or four is correct.

Question 23, Section B, omit entirely.

Question 16, Section B, Test 3, either punch or round nose chisel.

In view of these corrections, the Board decided to review all papers for this examination.

Communication was received from Frank O. Fleming requesting the Board to review his papers in connection with Machinists examination. He also requested permission to be present when the review was made. Upon motion by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Chenu, the Board decided to grant this request.

Communication was received from Verne Lewis, Patrolman, requesting that his personnel record be corrected to show continuous service from September 14, 1918, until the present time. Investigation of our records disclosed the fact that Mr. Lewis was not employed from June 16, 1919, to July 1, 1919. In view of this fact, the Board could not grant the request of Mr. Lewis.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:15 o'clock P.M.
