SUMMARY

This report recommends a user rate increase for golf services provided by the City of Sacramento at five municipal courses effective July 1, 1989. New revenue from the increased fees is estimated at \$410,000.

BACKGROUND

Overview:

The City golf courses are supported by user fees, revenue derived from concessions, and interest income and are operated as an enterprise fund. These revenue sources provide funds for authorized maintenance and operations, for ongoing Capital Improvement Programs, and for the debt service for development of new courses. The most recent new course is the Executive 9-hole course at Bing Maloney Golf Course.

The Golf Division is in the seventh year of its Council approved Ten-Year Capital Improvement Program. This program allows for projects such as greens rehabilitation, irrigation system improvements, upgrading existing facilities and infrastructures, and provides adequate future financing for development of the proposed South City Golf Course. As part of the proposed FY 1989-90 budget, various user fee increases are recommended as follows: \$0.50 per 9-hole round; \$1.00 per 18-hole round; and \$1.00 for advance reservation fees. The exception to this proposal is that there is no fee increase for the Bing Maloney Executive Nine Golf Course.

Additionally, it is recommended that the discount playcard be eliminated. Also, the 9-hole/sundown rate for Bing Maloney 18 and Haggin Oaks South courses will differentiate by \$2.35 over the regular 9-hole rates for Haggin Oaks Red and Blue courses and William Land Golf Course. Attachment I represents a listing of the existing fee structure, proposed changes, and their respective difference. Attachment II offers a comparison of City golf course fee structures with courses in the surrounding metropolitan area.

At the March 6, 1989 Sacramento Golf Council meeting, staff presented an overview of the above proposal. As a result, Golf Council directed staff to invite all home clubs to the April 5, 1989 Sacramento Golf Council meeting as a means of soliciting opinions and answering questions regarding the fee increases. Twenty-two individuals representing home clubs as well as the Sacramento Area Seniors Association were present. At this meeting, the fee proposal was explained and generally received in a positive manner. It appeared the only issue of controversy revolved around the elimination of the discount playcard.

In FY 1984-85, the playcard accounted for 30.0% of the Monday through Friday golf rounds, while seniors and juniors represented 10.0% and 2.6%, respectively (see Attachment III). In July, 1985, City Council action changed the age requirement for the senior discount from 70 to 65, and waived the city residency requirement to include Sacramento County residents. Since the inception of this expanded program, 5,000 seniors have applied for the senior discount card, of which approximately 60% are county residents. This change resulted in a shift from playcard use to the senior discount rate as individuals who used the playcard now qualified for the senior rate. 1987-88, the playcard accounted for 11.4% of the Monday through Friday golf rounds, while seniors and juniors represented 28.7% and 2.1% respectively (see Thus, 42.2% of the Monday through Friday rounds are presently Attachment IV). being played below cost. Seniors and juniors pay 30% less per rounds of golf and playcard users pay 20% less as compared to the daily green fee. Senior rounds are presently increasing by about 10% annually. This trend is anticipated to continue. In light of this trend, it is imperative to eliminate other below cost rounds to ensure the golf enterprise fund continues to meet future needs. Attachment V depicts the ratio of all golf rounds versus revenue generated in FY 1987-88.

Future Direction:

A 1986 feasibility study by William Sherman Company, Golf Course Consultants, determined that the Sacramento metropolitan area is short of meeting the playing demand for 18-hole golf courses by over 13 courses. Proposed future development of new city courses is directed at reducing this deficiency as well as providing golf at reasonable rates. Pending land annexation, the proposed

South City Golf Course represents the City's continuing effort towards meeting the demand for additional golf courses. It is anticipated that this course would be open for play in FY 1991-92. In order to ensure both a reasonable green fee structure and adequately finance an anticipated debt service of \$660,000 per year for this course, moderate user fee increases will be necessary over the next few years. The Budget Office has provided assistance in determining the appropriate fee increase schedule and cash flow necessary to meet the debt obligations. Attachment VI projects financial requirements for the Golf Division through FY 2003-04. The proposed FY 1989-90 resource versus expense budget is depicted in Attachment VII. Under this proposal, the recommended user fee increase ensures authorized fund accumulation for the proposed development of the South City Golf Course. Additionally, the proposal allows for a \$58,000 reserve or 1.84% contingency of the authorized maintenance and operation budget. The Budget Office recommends a 4% reserve as a prudent means of protection from unforeseen occurrences such as a decline in play due inclement weather or unexpected maintenance needs. However, the fund accumulation provides flexibility in financing such unforeseen occurrences. The priority of the department is to ensure a lower debt service for future golf courses, thus reducing the potential for substantial fee increases when the courses open.

Without the user fee increase, future development of golf courses will be severely hindered. Future direction of meeting the continuing demand of additional golf courses hinges on the City Council's commitment to this direction by approving the requested fee increase. This commitment provides the foundation for consideration of future action over the next few years.

FINANCIAL DATA

Without the recommended fee increases, which would produce an estimated \$410,000 in FY 1989-90, fund accumulation necessary for development of future golf courses as well as for other capital improvement programs will be severely impeded. The proposed FY 1989-90 Golf Division budget projects the proposed fee increases.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

The proposed fee increases are consistent with an enterprise fund being self-sufficient and recouping its expenditures from user fees. All noticing requirements and procedures for fee increases have been adhered to.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Budget and Finance Committee approve this report for referral to the full City Council for action. Further, it is recommended that the City Council, by resolution, approve the user fee increases for golf services effective July 1, 1989.


A RESOLUTION APPROVING USER RATE INCREASES FOR PARKS AND COMMUNITY SERVICES, GOLF DIVISION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

- 1. That the City Council hereby approve the recommended fees and charges of the Department of Parks and Community Services, Golf Division as set forth in Attachment I, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, effective July 1, 1989.
- 2. That the City of Sacramento Fee and Charge Report is hereby amended to reflect the Parks and Community Services, Golf Division fees as set forth in Attachment III.
- 3. Based upon the information presented to it and upon all information in the public record, and in compliance with Public Resources Code, Section 21080 (b) (8), the City Council finds: a) the increased fees are for the purpose of meeting operating expenses, including employee wage rates and fringe benefits; and b) the increased fees are for the purpose of meeting the ongoing Capital Improvement Program; and c) the increased fees are for the purpose of obtaining funds for the debt service for development of new courses.



^{**} To qualify for this reduced rate, persons 17 years and under must complete a training course provided by the Department of Parks and Community Services. A card is required.






FY 84-85 M-F GOLF ROUNDS



FY 87-88 M-F GOLF ROUNDS




FY 87-88 M-F REVENUE






FY 87-88 ALL GOLF ROUNDS

Golf Fund - Additional Fee Revenue and 7.00% inflation


