

SPECIAL MEETING  
SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL  
November 12, 1963

The Honorable City Council met in Special Session on this date at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M., Mayor McKinney presiding and roll call was answered as follows:

PRESENT: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Murphy, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

ABSENT: Councilman Mering.

Executed copies of the Call of the meeting issued by the Mayor and presented by the City Clerk were ordered filed.

The Call stated the purpose of the meeting to be that of :

1. Completeing canvass of results of the Regular Municipal Election, November 5, 1963.
2. Considering Resolution providing for notification to State of any activities affecting properties in the State Capitol Plan Area.
3. Considering rezoning appeal, Lot 1103, Tallac Village No. 8.

and to present such other matters as may regularly come before said body or be presented by the City Manager.

Pursuant to Section 194 of the City Charter the Honorable City Council convened at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M., as the City Board of Canvassers to canvass the Returns of the Regular Municipal and Regular School District Election held on date of November 5, 1963, for the purpose of selection of nine (9) members of the City Council of the City of Sacramento and four (4) members of the Board of Education of the Sacramento City Unified School District.

In compliance with Resolution No. 733, adopted November 7, 1963, the following report of the Assistant Canvassing Board was presented and read at this time:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk be and he is hereby authorized to issue certificates of election to the successful candidates herein named; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Proposal "A" amending Article XXIII, Sections 239 and 240 of the City Charter providing that petitions may be circulated among voters, having received a majority of votes cast for said amendment is hereby declared to have been duly ratified, and adopted by the people of the City of Sacramento at said election; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Proposal "B" allowing for terms of four (4) years for members of the City Council having failed to receive a majority of all of the votes cast of said proposition is hereby declared to have failed of passage and is therefore defeated and lost; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Proposal "C" providing payment of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per meeting to each member of the Housing Code Advisory And Appeals Board, having received a majority of votes cast for said amendment is hereby declared to have been duly ratified and adopted by the people of the City of Sacramento at said election; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk of the City of Sacramento be and he is hereby directed to prepare a certification of foregoing action by the people of said City on foregoing Charter amendments, submitting same to the City Attorney, who is hereby ordered and directed to have said amendment submitted to and ratified by the Legislature of the State of California, through Sacramento's legislative representatives; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the consolidated tabulation sheet prepared by the City Clerk, showing the number of votes cast in all precincts for each candidate and the number of votes for and against each Charter amendment submitted at said election, is hereby made a part of this resolution and attached to the original thereof on file in office of the City Clerk; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that with the adoption of this resolution the City Council hereby declares its duty as a canvassing board to have been completed and thereupon adjourns.

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Seconded by Councilman Murphy and carried by the following vote:

AYES: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Murphy, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

ABSENT: Councilman Mering.

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Councilman Mering arrived at this time.

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The Council adjourned as the City Board of Canvassers at the hour of 8:25 o'clock P.M.

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Having been continued from the Regular Meeting of November 7, 1963, the proposed resolution providing for City cooperation with the State of California to facilitate the carrying forward of the State Capitol Plan was considered at this time.

Upon the verbal recommendation of the Assistant City Manager, Councilman Domich moved that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLUTION NO. 735

WHEREAS the City of Sacramento desires to again place itself on record as fully supporting the State Capitol Plan, adopted by the legislature pursuant to Section 8169.5 of the Government Code, in recognition of its paramount importance to the people of California and the City of Sacramento, and

WHEREAS it desires to cooperate with the State in the expeditious implementation thereof, and

WHEREAS it is desirous that the State be informed forthwith of any indication that private construction is proposed within the area of the STATE CAPITOL PLAN, in order to allow the State, if it so desires, to commence acquisition proceedings prior to needless expenditures by the property owners,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

1. That the City of Sacramento hereby expresses its full and continuous support for the State Capitol Plan.
2. That all city officials are to cooperate with the State of California and its officials, insofar as possible to facilitate the carrying forward of the State Capitol Plan.
3. That the City Planning Director, the City Building Inspector, the City Engineer, or any other city official who either directly or through employees under him receives requests for information concerning such proposed construction shall forthwith upon receipt of the same, and prior to any consideration of any applications upon their merits, inform the applicant of the State Capitol Plan and transmit to the Director of General Services or his designated representative, 1108 O Street, Sacramento, California, all pertinent information.
4. That a copy of this resolution be promptly transmitted to the City Manager, the City Planning Director, the City Building Inspector, the City Engineer and the State Director of General Services.

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Seconded by Councilman Talkin and carried by the following vote:

AYES: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Mering, Murphy, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

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Having been continued from the Regular Meeting of November 7, 1963, the matter of appeal from Planning Commission denial of request to rezone Lot 1103 Tallac Village No. 8, from the R-1 Single Family Zone to the "OB" Office Building Zone, was considered at this time.

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Following brief Council discussion of the matter, Councilman Talkin moved that the subject property be rezoned to the Office Building Zone with condition that a bungalow - type office building only be allowed under the rezoning.

Seconded by Councilman Domich and roll call resulted as follows:

AYES: Councilmen Christensen, Domich and Talkin.

NOES: Councilmen Marriott, McKinney, Mering, Murphy, Nielsen and Rouse.

Mayor McKinney then announced that the appeal was denied.

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Councilman Christensen moved that Councilman Talkin be authorized to leave the State.

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Seconded by Councilman Marriott and carried by the following vote:

AYES: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Mering, Murphy, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

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Council adjourned at the hour of 8:40 o'clock P.M.
