SUMMARY:

Valley Vision, the organization promoting this regional compact, a non-profit research and education organization, addresses the growth problems and challenges facing the six-county Sacramento Region. The Capital Region Compact is a vehicle to demonstrate support by governmental, agency and the private sector for collaborative regional planning.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

This proposed agreement among 21 cities and 6 counties in the Sacramento Metropolitan area is aimed at combating urban sprawl and promoting regional collaboration and problem solving. Cities and Counties that sign the compact pledge to work together to maximize the benefits of population growth while protecting the communities and the region from the problems caused by urban sprawl.
