SUBJECT: 1. Environmental Determination

> 2. Ordinance Adding Sections 2-B-12, 2-E-27, and 22-A-67 to and Amending Sections 22-A-44 and 22-A-46 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance Relating to Medical or Dental Clinics or Offices. (M-601)

### SUMMARY

The proposed ordinance amendment would require special permit review by the City Planning Commission for all medical related office uses within the City boundaries. The staff and Planning Commission recommend approval of the ordinance amendment.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City Council requested the staff prepare an ordinance that would require special permit approval for medical type offices for a portion of the East Sacramento area. The staff subsequently prepared the ordinance and presented it to the Planning Commission for review and consideration. The Planning Commission felt that the special permit requirement for office uses would be appropriate because medically related office uses are more intense than general office type uses. They have a tendency to generate more traffic and create parking problems on adjacent streets.

The staff and Planning Commission, however, felt that the special permit requirement should apply City-wide rather than be limited to East Sacramento. The problems associated with medical offices are apparent in other locations as well. The Planning Commission, therefore, recommended that the special permit apply to all medical office type uses throughout the City. The attached ordinance reflects the Planning Commission's recommendation.

# VOTE OF COMMISSION

On August 27, 1981, the Planning Commission, by a vote of seven ayes, two absent, recommended approval of the ordinance amendment.

# RECOMMENDATION

The staff and Planning Commission recommend that the City Council approve the ordinance amendment by:

- Ratifying the Negative Declaration; and
- 2. Adopting the attached Ordinance Amendment.

Sec. 22-A-44 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

44. Day Care Facility: A facility which provides supervision, care, instruction, or therapy to six (6) or fewer individuals, per day during daytime hours. This category shall include day care clinics, children's day nurseries, children's day care centers, and workshops for the handicapped, but shall not include facilities providing medical examinations, diagnosis, and treatment of individuals. For purposes of this definition, the term "six (6) or fewer" shall include only those persons receiving the supervision, care, instruction, or therapy and shall not include members of the resident family or individuals employed as facility staff. Facilities providing the services described herein to more than six (6) individuals per day shall be deemed group care facilities.

### SECTION 3.

Sec. 22-A-46 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

46. Group Care Facility: A facility which is not a day care facility, a family care facility, a medical or dental clinic or office, or a major medical care facility and which provides resident personal services, supervision, or assistance essential for sustaining the activities of daily living, or for the protection of the individual, on a twenty-four (24) hour a day basis, or which provides supervision, care, instruction, or therapy to individuals on a drop-in basis or otherwise.

# SECTION 4.

Sec. 22-A-67 is hereby added to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance to read as follows:

67. Medical and Dental Clinics or Offices: A facility other than a day care facility, family care facility, or group care facility which provides examination, diagnosis, or treatment for medical, dental, or similar purposes on an outpatient basis.

Sec. 22-A-44 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

44. Day Care Facility: A facility which provides supervision, care, instruction, or therapy to six (6) or fewer individuals, exeluding members—of—the—resident—family, per day during daytime hours. This category shall include day care treatment clinics, children's day nurseries, children's day care centers, and workshops for the handicapped, but shall not include facilities providing medical examinations, diagnosis, and treatment of individuals. For purposes of this definition, the term "six (6) or fewer" shall include only those persons receiving the supervision, care, instruction, or therapy and shall not include members of the resident family or individuals employed as facility staff. Facilities providing the services described herein to more than six (6) individuals per day shall be deemed group care facilities.

### SECTION 3.

Sec. 22-A-46 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

46. Group Care Facility: A facility which is not a day care facility, a family care facility, a medical or dental clinic or office, or a major medical care facility and which provides resident personal services, supervision, or assistance essential for sustaining the activities of daily living, or for the protection of the individual, on a twenty-four (24) hour a day basis, or which provides supervision, care, instruction or medical-treatment therapy to individuals on a drop-in basis or otherwise.

# SECTION 4.

Sec. 22-A-67 is hereby added to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance to read as follows:

67. Medical and Dental Clinics or Offices: A facility other than a day care facility, family care facility, or group care facility which provides examination, diagnosis, or treatment for medical; dental, or similar purposes on an outpatient basis.

Ordinance adding Sections 2-B-12, 2-E-27 and 22-A-67 to and amending Sections 22-A-44 and 22-A-46 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance relating to medical or dental

clinics or offices (M-601)

SUMMARY: The proposed ordinance amendment would basically require special permit review by the City Planning Commission for all medical related office uses. The special permit review, however, will be limited to the area bounded by H Street to the north, 65th Street, Elvas Avenue and 57th Street on the east, Folsom Boulevard on the south, and Alhambra Boulevard on the west.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: At the request of the City Council, staff prepared the above referenced ordinance to regulate medical type offices for a portion of the East Sacramento area. The purpose of the ordinance is to allow review of medical offices in this area because of parking problems associated with this type offices. the past, the location of medical offices along the major east/west streets has created parking problems in adjacent residential areas. Many offices were developed with insufficient parking spaces. The ordinance also includes a clarification of several definitions that apply to the proposed amendment.

Staff agrees with the concept of requiring a special permit for medical type offices because it is a use that normally generates more parking demand than what is required by the Zoning Ordinance. It is a sensitive use when located adjacent to residential areas because on-street parking normally overflows into the residential area. however, believes that the requirement for a special permit for medical offices should not be confined only to the Esat Sacramento area. It should apply City-wide. There are medical offices in other parts of the City that experience the same parking problems.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends that the ordinance be approved with a modification that the special permit requirement for medical offices apply to the entire City.

### SECTION 2.

Sec. 2-E-27 is hereby added to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance to read as follows:

27. Medical or Dental Clinics or Offices in Certain Areas.

A special permit must be obtained to establish medical or dental clinics or offices in the area bounded by H Street on the north, 65th Street, Elvas Avenue and 57th Street on the east, Folsom Boulevard on the south and Alhambra Boulevard on the west.

### SECTION 3.

Sec. 22-A-44 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

A4. Day Care Facility: A facility which provides supervision, care, instruction, or therapy to six (6) or fewer individuals, per day during daytime hours. This category shall include day care clinics, children's day nurseries, children's day care centers, and workshops for the handicapped, but shall not include facilities providing medical examinations, diagnosis, and treatment of individuals. For purposes of this definition, the term "six (6) or fewer" shall include only those persons receiving the supervision, care,



instruction, or therapy and shall not include members of the resident family or individuals employed as facility staff. Facilities providing the services described herein to more than six (6) individuals per day shall be deemed group care facilities.

# SECTION 4.

Sec. 22-A-46 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

46. Group Care Facility. A facility which is not a day care facility, a family care facility, a medical or dental clinic or office, or a major medical care facility and which provides resident personal services, supervision, or assistance essential for sustaining the activities of daily living, or for the protection of the individual, on a twenty-four (24) hours a day basis, or which provides supervision, care, instruction, or therapy to individuals on a drop-in basis or otherwise.

Sec. 22-A-67 is hereby added to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance to read as follows:

67. Medical and Dental Clinics or Offices: A facility other than a day care facility, family care facility, or group care facility which provides examination, diagnosis, or treatment for medical, dental, or similar purposes on an outpatient basis.
