SUBJECT: Proposition One - California Parklands Act of 1980

SUMMARY:

The California Parklands Act of 1980, more commonly called Proposition One, is a measure on the California ballot for November of 1980. It provides for the sale of general obligation bonds in the amount of \$285 million to finance acquisition and development of new parks and the rehabilitation of existing parks. Proposition One will provide funding for local government park projects in the amount of \$85 million.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The demand for parks and recreation facilities in California is greater than the supply. Funding from previous park bond acts (1964, 1974, and 1976) is now nearly exhausted but the need is escalating annually.

Proposition One provides \$85 million to cities, counties, and special districts to assist in the local effort to provide park and recreational facilities. Selection of local projects occurs on a county-wide basis. Each county will submit a list of priorities by January 1, 1982 and that list must be approved by at least one-half of the local governmental agencies in the county representing one-half or more of its population and by the board of supervisors. The City Council will set priorities for the City and make recommendations to the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors.

FINANCIAL DATA:

Sacramento County's allotted portion of the \$85 million local fund is estimated to be \$2,732,229. Of that amount, the City of Sacramento is expected to receive up to \$700,000 for City projects and share in funds for County-wide or regional projects.

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RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Law and Legislative Committee approve the attached resolution and recommend approval to the full City Council.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING STATE PROPOSITION ONE WHICH PLACES BEFORE THE VOTERS OF CALIFORNIA A BOND MEASURE TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR ACQUISITION AND DEVELOPMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION PROJECTS

WHEREAS, parks and recreation programs vastly enhance our urban environment; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council hereby supports the passage of Proposition One.
