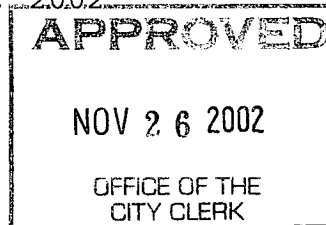

SUMMARY:

This report requests adoption of the attached resolution which declares the official results of the November 5, 2002 General Municipal Election as certified by the County Registrar of Voters.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On November 5, 2002, a General Municipal Election was held in the City of Sacramento for the purpose of allowing the voters to vote upon a question of:

Measure S: (City Charter Amendment)

- An Initiative Measure Amending Sections 29 and 44 of the Sacramento City Charter, to Specify that the Office of Mayor Shall be a full time Office, and that Compensation For the Mayor and Council Members Shall be Established by a Compensation Commission;

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and,

Measure T: (City Code Amendment)

- An Initiative Measure Amending title 3, chapter 3.32 of the Sacramento City Code to Reduce the City of Sacramento Utility User Tax From 7.5% to 2.5% Over a Four Year Period and to Amend the Existing Utility User Tax Refund Procedure to Eliminate the Age and Disability Eligibility Requirements

- An Initiative Measure Amending title 3, chapter 3.32 of the Sacramento City Code to Reduce the City of Sacramento Utility User Tax From 7.5% to 2.5% Over a Four Year Period and to Amend the Existing Utility User Tax Refund Procedure to Eliminate the Age and Disability Eligibility Requirements failed.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

On June 11, 2002, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2002-361 and Resolution No. 2002-362 authorizing the County Elections Department to canvass the returns of this election.

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the City of Sacramento, California, on Tuesday, November 5, 2002, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, notice of the election was given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that precincts were properly established; that election officers were appointed and that in all respects the election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 2002-361 and Resolution No. 2002-362 adopted June 11, 2002, the County Election Department canvassed the returns of the election and has certified the results to this City Council, the results are received, attached and made a part hereof as "**Exhibit A**".

"Shall Chapter 3.32 of Title 3 of the Sacramento City Code be amended to reduce the City of Sacramento utility user tax from seven and one-half percent (7.5%) to two and one-half percent (2.5%) over a four year period; and to eliminate the age and disability eligibility requirements of the existing utility user tax refund procedure?"



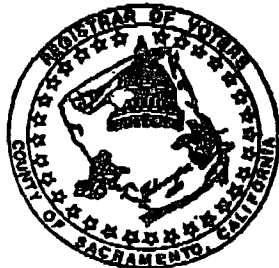
