SUBJECT: CONTINUATION OF TEMPORARY BUILDING POSITIONS

SUMMARY

In August, the City Council approved the employment of six additional Building Inspectors to meet the workload demands generated by permits for 5,000 apartment units. This authority expires this month. Construction is continuing on over 3,000 of these units, and these additional Inspectors will continue to be needed through June 30, 1986 to meet this workload effectively.

Funding is available within Planning and Development Department's budget and no additional General Fund appropriation is required.

SUBJECT: CONTINUATION OF TEMPORARY BUILDING POSITIONS

SUMMARY

In August, the City Council approved six additional Building Inspectors to meet increased workload demands created by the high level of apartment construction. The authority for these positions expires this month, but the level of construction continues at a high level. To meet this continued workload demand, authority is needed to fill these positions through the end of the fiscal year.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In August, the City Council approved the filling of six limited-term Building Inspector I positions, and two Typist Clerk II positions to meet the workload generated by building permits for 5,000 apartment units. This authority expires on February 14, 1986. Over 3,000 of these units are still under construction, and with lower interest rates, single family construction remains at a high level. The workload being generated by these apartments and other construction cannot effectively be handled without these six additional Inspectors.

The Planning and Development Department is requesting the authority to extend the six limited-term Building Inspector I positions and one clerical position through June 30, 1986. This authority will give the Department the ability to meet the demand without creating significant inspection delays for the construction industry.
