SALARY SURVEY REPORT

The Secretary reported that the Salary Survey Report, recommending a general one and one-half step increase for all monthly salaried employees, plus additional one step adjustments for certain classes, to cost an estimated \$625,000 for the fiscal year 1957-58, had been submitted to the City Council on March 14, 1957 for their consideration.

EXEMPT POSITIONS

REQUEST FOR REINSTATEMENT

Promotional Status

The Secretary advised that the original announcement notice for this examination provided that City employees with permanent status as Junior Clerk would be allowed to participate in the examination on a promotional basis. Upon recommendation of the Secretary, it was properly moved and passed that those employees of the City with permanent status as Library Clerk should also be permitted to participate on a promotional basis.

MACHINISTS' UNION REQUEST  
PREVAILING WAGE SCALES

Mr. Frank Kinner and Mr. Lennis Tupper, representing the Machinists' Union Local #33, and Wm. Rogers, Foreman Machinist in the Water Department, appeared before the Board relative to their request of September 28, 1956, that the City adopt the pay rates in the Union contract covering Machinists employed by the Sacramento Bee and the State Printing Plant to apply to Machinists employed

by the City, the rates of pay in the Reeves and Teichert contract, as is the present policy. The Secretary advised that on the basis of information obtained in October 1956, the rates paid to Machinists under the Reeves & Teichert contract were very close to the rates paid for similar machinist work at Aerojet Corporation and that no further study had been made.

It was the contention of the representatives of the Machinists' Union that the work performed by employees of the City in this craft is more comparable with work performed at the Printing Plant and the Sacramento Bee Publishing Company than the work performed by Machinists working under the Reeves Teichert contract. Present pay scales are as follows:

After discussion, the Secretary was instructed to prepare a study of the type of Machinist work performed and the pay rates applying in all local firms and establishments where Machinists are employed and to make report and recommendations at the next meeting of the Board.

#### EXEMPT POSITIONS

As per request of the Board at the meeting held March 20, 1957, the City Attorney Everett M. Glenn submitted two proposals in the form of Charter amendments for consideration. The City Attorney advised that in his opinion, a Charter amendment was the best method to be followed in order to include many of the present exempt positions under civil service and in order to "blanket in" employees in the exempt positions.

PROPOSAL #1. "The first proposal is so drafted that it specifically names the heads of departments and major divisions thereof, who will be exempt from the classified service, and in addition one principal assistant is also excluded. This, in our opinion, will allow only those persons who are set forth therein to be exempt, and all other officers and employees not included within this list will become a part of the classified service."

PROPOSAL #2. "The second proposal is similar, in that it exempts all elected officials, boards and commissions, the City Manager and his private Secretary, the heads of departments, and the principal assistant or assistants in each department. The term "head of department" is defined as a person who exercises supervisory control over a group of employees and directs the activities of a branch of municipal service. All reference to professionally educated persons has been deleted."

The City Attorney was asked by Chairman Kenneth Wright if this might also be accomplished by means of an ordinance. Mr. Glenn stated that in his opinion it could be accomplished by means of an ordinance, although he felt that a Charter amendment would be the proper method, because the provision referring to "all professionally educated persons and experts employed by the City in their professional capacity" could either be deleted or reworded.

The City Attorney was requested to draft an ordinance which would in his opinion, upon adoption by the City Council, have the same effect of bringing exempt positions under civil service and blanketing in present employees as by the proposed Charter amendments. This ordinance to be submitted in time for study at the next Civil Service Board Meeting to be held April 24, 1957.

It was suggested by Mr. Deise that in this ordinance the City Attorney might outline the various classes which in his opinion would be exempted by interpretation of Section 43 of the City Charter. The Attorney was further advised that it was the intent of the Board to exclude from civil service only Department Heads, Chief Deputies in each department, elected officials, Boards or Commissions and other professionally trained employees as might be decided upon.
