

ORDINANCE NO. 1592, FOURTH SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SUBDIVISIONS I AND K OF SECTION 7 OF ORDINANCE NO. 1241, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED DECEMBER 27, 1946, AND ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO DISASTERS, AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY"; AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1: Subdivision I of Section 7 of Ordinance No. 1241, Fourth Series, passed December 27, 1946, is hereby amended to read as follows:

I. AMERICAN RED CROSS. The American Red Cross in the City of Sacramento will, in natural disaster, furnish food, clothing, shelter, registration and information service, supplementary medical service when requested, and rehabilitation to individuals and families affected by the disaster.

In war-caused disaster, the American Red Cross will furnish only food, clothing and shelter to affected individuals and families.

The American Red Cross will provide funds with which to finance all its relief operations during natural disaster. Civil defense financing will be provided by public or private agencies other than the Red Cross for Red Cross Functions in war-caused disasters.

The Director shall be responsible for arranging, through the chairman of the local Red Cross Chapter, for the participation of the Red Cross in civil defense as a part of the mass care service in case of war-caused disaster, and for the relationship between the Red Cross and the civil defense organization in case of natural disaster.

SECTION 2: Subdivision K of Section 7 of Ordinance No. 1241, Fourth Series, passed December 27, 1946, is hereby amended to read as follows:

K. WELFARE SERVICES DIVISION. This division shall be under and subject to the control of the Executive Secretary of the Community Welfare Council of Sacramento County, Incorporated, who shall serve as chief of the Welfare Services Division.

It shall be the duty of this division to develop specific plans and operational procedures to carry out the following general functions in the event of a disaster: (1) evacuation of persons from affected areas; (2) providing food, shelter,


and clothing on mass care basis; (3) individualized emergency welfare and rehabilitative services; (4) registration of persons, answering inquiries concerning them, and general community informational service. The Superintendent of Recreation shall be responsible for planning recreational services as might be required in the work of this division. The Chief of the division shall be empowered to make maximum use of the resources of existing agencies, public and private, and to create such working committees or advisory council necessary to discharge the responsibilities of the division.

The Division shall cooperate with the American Red Cross, and the Health Division. This Division shall coordinate its activities with the activities of the Red Cross, so that there shall be no duplication of effort.

SECTION 3: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and shall take effect immediately.
