SUBJECT: RECREATION DIVISION - FEE INCREASES

SUMMARY

This report provides information regarding sports league fees and athletic field use fees. Further, this report recommends the City Council approve, by resolution, various sports league fee and athletic field use fee increases to be effective February 5, 1991.

BACKGROUND

Over 1,300 teams representing more than 20,000 players participate in a variety of sports leagues annually. League play is conducted in basketball, baseball, volleyball, and softball. Competition ranges from recreational to highly skilled in men's, women's and co-ed divisions of play. Also, over 15,000 permits are issued annually for the use of our athletic fields. These permits are issued to little leagues, schools, teams, and other community organizations.

All revenue generated from sports league fees and athletic field use is deposited to the sports revenue account, which directly supports the sports programs.

Expenditures for these programs include career staff up to the Recreation Program Coordinator level, all part-time staff and officials associated with these activities, and all equipment necessary to provide the activities and related services. In order to continue to recover the necessary costs as they relate to sports leagues, staff recommends league registration fee and field usage fee increases.

Recommended fees (Exhibit A) relate directly to increased services and supplies, part-time staffing of the programs, and officials' fees necessary to conduct these activities. The percent increase in fees (Exhibit B) varies between activities. The last fee increase in sports leagues was made in February 1990.

FINANCIAL DATA

The recommended fee increases will generate an estimated total of \$23,149 in additional revenue to the Sports Revenue Account. These increases will cover additional expenditures as they relate to each sports league service provided.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

This fee increase is consistent with Department policy to recover costs associated with sports leagues while maintaining reasonable costs for league participants.



RECOMMENDATION



RESOLUTION AMENDING THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO FEE AND CHARGE REPORT TO INCREASE FEES FOR SPORTS LEAGUE AND ATHLETIC FIELD USE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

1. That effective February 5, 1991, Parks and Community Services sports league fees and athletic field use fees are hereby amended as set forth in Exhibit A and B attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
2. The City of Sacramento Fee and Charge Report is hereby amended to reflect the increased fees as set forth in Exhibits A and B.
3. Based upon the information presented to it and upon all information in the public record, and in compliance with Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(8), the City Council finds:
 - a. The increased fees are for the purpose of meeting operating expenses.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that hearings will be held by the Sacramento City Council Budget and Finance Committee on January 29, 1991 at 2:00 p.m. and the Sacramento City Council on February 5, 1991 at 7:30 p.m., in City Council Chambers, 915 I Street, Sacramento, to consider a resolution increasing fees for various sports leagues and the use of athletic fields.

TO BE PUBLISHED PURSUANT TO GOVERNEMENT CODE 6062a -- two times, first time at least 10 days before the Budget and Finance Committee hearing; then at least five days must intervene before the second publication, not counting the publication dates themselves. Second publication to occur before Budget and Finance Committee hearing.
