REQUEST FOR SALARY ADJUSTMENTS
AND CHANGE OF SURVEY PROCEDURE:
Roger Ekar, Representative
Stationary Engineers, Local #39

Communication from Roger
Ekar, Business Represen-
tative of Stationary

Engineers, Local #39, and representing Water Department Plant Operators, dated September 23, 1969, requesting a change in the salary survey procedures to include only cities and agencies in Northern California, was read and considered. Mr. Ekar was present and outlined the reasons for the request on the basis that such cities as Los Angeles, Burbank, Long Beach, Glendale, Fresno, and San Diego are outside the area from which the City recruits for applicants.

Mr. Ekar was questioned by the Board members and was advised that the City Charter provisions stipulate that "...the Board shall take into consideration the generally prevailing rates for such services in other California cities of comparable size..." without reference to geographical location.

Mr. Huebner addressed the Board and indicated that some of the cities which have been used in the past for salary comparison purposes, such as Alameda and Santa Monica, are not really comparable with the City of Sacramento and suggested that the Board should give consideration to revising the group

and agencies used in connection with the annual salary survey. considerable discussion of the proposal by Mr. Ekar and the suggestion of Mr. Huebner, it was the consensus of the Board that there was insufficient time to give consideration to revising the survey procedures and the Board was instructed to prepare a survey using the same cities and agencies used in 1968.

Mr. Ekar thereupon withdrew his request for changing the selection of agencies to include only those from Northern California, but requested that the salary range for Plant Operator II be reallocated to Range No. 48 (\$860 per month), and that all other classes in the Plant Operator series be adjusted accordingly.

It was the order of the Board that action on the request be held in abeyance pending completion of the salary survey.

OF CLASSIFICATION PLAN:

Secretary advised that a classification survey had been com-

pleted in the Street Tree Division and recommended that certain classifications be revised and re-titled. These classes are as follows:
