Description/Analysis

Issue: The Pavement Maintenance section of the Street Services Division has an ongoing need for weed control of roadside shoulders. After three annual extensions and the requirement of additional services, the total amount spent with this contractor will exceed \$100,000 and requires Council approval.

Policy Considerations: The recommendations in this report are consistent with the City's Strategic Plan goals to improve and expand public safety, and achieve sustainability and livability.

Environmental Considerations: None

Commission/Committee Action: None

Rationale for Recommendation: The Pavement Maintenance section of the Street Services Division has a nonprofessional services agreement with Sun

Harvest, Inc. for slope mowing at various locations throughout the City. Due to the continued need for this service, staff recommends that additional services, as well as final annual extension of the agreement for next fiscal year be approved.

Financial Considerations: Sufficient funds are available in the Street Services operating and CIP budgets for this service and sufficient funds are anticipated to be budgeted in the operating and CIP budgets for next fiscal year's final extension.

Background

City Manager Agreement CM 2004-0465 was awarded to Sun Harvest, Inc. as an informal nonprofessional services agreement on June 25, 2004 in the amount not to exceed \$17,950 for mowing of designated north and south areas throughout the City. Supplemental agreements have extended the agreement annually for three years and have included occasional additional services as required. The contractor provides equipment and labor for slope mowing at roadsides for critical weed control and safety.

At this time, with the extensions and additional services required, the total of the original agreement amount plus supplemental agreements will now exceed \$100,000 and requires Council approval. Sun Harvest, Inc. has done this work efficiently and in a timely manner, and staff expects to extend the agreement for the final allowed annual extension for next fiscal year. Staff requests Council approval for both the additional services, and the annual extension at this time.

BACKGROUND
