


RESOLUTION NO. 257

FOR THE PURPOSE OF FACILITATING THE MOVING
OF TRAFFIC AND THE PROTECTION OF PUBLIC
INDIVIDUALLY DURING THE HOLDING OF THE
STATE FAIR,

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the Superintendent
of Streets of the City of Sacramento be, and he is hereby,
directed to barricade all that certain street and strip
of land known, designated and described as being a
roadway forty (40) feet in width running easterly from
the Stockton Boulevard to a point opposite the Easterly
line of Lot No. 191 of Wright & Kimbrough Tract No. 9,
the same being bounded on the North by the State
Agriculture Society's land; said strip being commonly
known as an extension of Fourth Avenue, along the southerly
boundary line of the State Agriculture Society's land,
and to keep the same barricaded and closed from the date
commencing September 3rd, 1927, and ending September 10th,
1927, both dates inclusive.
