

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 2664

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council of the City of Sacramento, that the public interest and convenience require that the work hereinafter described should be done:

NOW THEREFORE, the said City Council does hereby resolve and declare that it is the intention of said City Council to order the following street work to be done to-wit:

To close, vacate, and abandon a portion of the Alley in the block bounded by G and H Streets, 14th and 15th Streets, from the Westerly line of 15th Street to a point 120 feet westerly therefrom.

And said City Council does hereby determine and declare that said proposed work and improvement is of more than local or ordinary public benefit and will affect and benefit the lands and district hereinafter described, and which said district is hereby declared to be the district affected, and benefited by said work and improvement and that therefore the entire damages, costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be and are hereby made chargeable against and shall be assessable upon said lands and district, which district is within the City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of California.

The exterior boundaries of the land affected and benefited by said work and improvement are particularly described as follows:

On the North by G Street,
On the South by H Street,
On the West by 14th Street,
On the East by 15th Street;

And the said City Council does hereby elect to proceed to do said work under the provisions of Division 9, Part 3, "Streets and Highways Code", the "Street Vacation Act of 1941", being an Act of Legislature of the State of California, approved May 13th, 1941.

Notice is hereby given that all persons interested in or objecting to the proposed vacation, may appear before the said City Council, in the Council Chamber, located on "I" Street between 9th and 10th Streets in said City on October 31st, 1947 at 8:00 P.M. and be heard in the matter.

The Sacramento Union is hereby designated as the daily newspaper published and circulated in said City, in which this Resolution shall be published, and the Superintendent of Streets is hereby directed to post notices of the passage of this Resolution in the manner as required by law.
