Gentlemen:

We are property owners adjacent to the newly opened Holiday Inn located at 1900 Canterbury Road.

As this property was being developed we felt sure proper attention would be given to insure the best interests of the Holiday Inn and the property owners being affected by this development. This does not seem to be the case.

As their parking area abuts the property of the undersigned we feel that a screening fence dividing C-2 and R-1 property should be provided. It is our understanding that Sacramento has an ordinance which would require such screening. Mr. Ralston has spoken to Mr. Smith who appears to be in charge of the development and he has stated they do not intend to fence their property. This appears to be poor planning on their part due to the fact they also have a large, open swimming pool which constitutes a hazard to the small children in the neighborhood.

We do not wish to be arbitrary but we do feel our property is being adversely affected and an invasion of our privacy exists. We believe this could be corrected to the mutual advantage of all concerned.

We respectfully request your guidance in correcting this situation. Please direct your reply to Mrs. Murphy whom we have asked to help coordinate our efforts.
