## RESOLUTION No. 938

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

December 23, 1954

WHEREAS, the Sacramento City Council having pledged itself to cooperate with President Eisenhower's Action Committee for Traffic Safety by giving its support to the promotion of, and proclaiming December 15, 1954 as S-D Day -- Safe Driving Day, and

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the attention of the Sacramento City Council that Albert J. Veglia, a resident of Sacramento and California State Registrar of Motor Vehicles, originated the idea for the observance of a Safe Driving Day, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Veglia's proposal was endorsed by President Eisenhower and resulted in plans for a nation-wide demonstration with the hope of proving that death and injury may be avoided if all Americans do their full part in making S-D Day a success, and

WHEREAS, recognizing that Albert J. Veglia of Sacramento conceived the plan that led to the observance of a national Safe Driving Day, the Sacramento City Council on behalf of the citizenry as a whole, hereby highly commends Albert J. Veglia for proposing a national campaign, the purpose of which was to demonstrate that motorists and pedestrians alike could eliminate accidents by their own actions, thus encouraging safer driving, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sacramento City Council gives public recognition to Albert J. Veglia for conceiving this original and humane idea and hereby orders this resolution spread upon the official minutes of the instant meeting of the City Council.
