

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION, NO. 2135

RESOLVED, by the city council of the City of Sacramento, State of California: That it is the intention of the said city council to order the following street work to be done in said city, to-wit:

To open a new street to be known as San Jose Way, the same to be 40 feet in width, from the southerly line of Sherman Way to a point 120 feet southerly therefrom and from the northerly line of 2nd Avenue to a point 111.73 feet northerly therefrom and to open a new street to be known as Y. Street from the easterly line of the alley first west of 41st Street to the easterly line of 42nd Street, said street to be 40 feet in width and within the boundaries of the Wright and Kimbrough Tract, Number 27, "a subdivision," and 45 feet in width within the boundaries of Dawson Place, "a subdivision."

The lands necessary and convenient to be taken for said purposes are described as follows:

PARCEL NO. 1

The easterly one-half of lot number 1538 of Wright and Kimbrough Tract Number 30, "a subdivision."

PARCEL NO. 2

Beginning at a point on the northerly line of 2nd Avenue, of the City of Sacramento, said point being further described as being located $5.82^{\circ} 44' W.$ 120.87 feet from the southwest corner of "Wright and Kimbrough Tract No. 27 (as the same is shown on the official map thereof, filed in the office of the County Recorder of Sacramento, County, State of California);

thence from the point of beginning 582° 44' W.
40.29 feet along the northerly line of 2nd Avenue
to a point; thence No° 23' W. 11.73 feet to a
point; thence N 82° 44' E. 40.29 feet to a point;
thence 50° 23' E. 111.73 feet to the point of
beginning and containing 0.102 acres.

PARCEL NO. 3

Lot 1247 in Wright and Kimbrough Tract
Number 27, "a subdivision."

PARCEL NO. 4

Lot 1270 in Wright and Kimbrough Tract
Number 27, "a subdivision."

PARCEL NO. 5

Lot 11 in Dawson Place, "a subdivision."

And said council does hereby determine and
declare that said proposed work and improvement is of
more than local or ordinary public benefit, and will
effect and benefit the lands and district hereinafter
described, and which said district is hereby declared to
be the district affected and benefited by said work and
improvement, and that therefore the entire damages, costs
and expenses of said work and improvement shall be and
are hereby made chargeable against and shall be assessable
upon said lands and district, which district is within the
City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of
California; and the exterior boundaries of the lands
affected and benefited by said work and improvement are
particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the north east corner of 37th and
2nd Avenue, thence easterly along the northerly line of
2nd Avenue to the westerly line of Stockton Boulevard,

thence northerly along the westerly line of Stockton Boulevard to the southerly line of Sherman Way; thence westerly on the southerly line of Sherman Way to the easterly line of 37th Street, thence southerly on the easterly line of 37th Street to the point of beginning. Saving and excepting from said district all public streets, avenues, roads therein included and contained.

All of the herein proposed work shall be done in pursuance of an act of the legislature of the State of California entitled, "An act to provide for laying out, opening, extending, widening, straightening or closing up, in whole or in part any street, square, lane, alley court or place within municipalities, and to condemn and acquire any and all land and property necessary or convenient for that purpose," approved March 6, 1889, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto.

The subdivisions referred to herein are as shown on the official plats on file in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California.

The Sacramento Union is hereby designated as the daily newspaper published and circulated in said city in which the superintendent's notice of the passage of this resolution shall be published.
