

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2011-407**

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

### **APPLICATION FOR SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOLS FUNDING FOR TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT RIO LINDA BOULEVARD AND ACACIA AVENUE AND SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENTS TO ACACIA**

#### **BACKGROUND**

- A. The State of California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has issued a call for projects to receive funding from the Federal Safe Routes to Schools Grant Program.
- B. Proposed projects for the Safe Routes to Schools Grant Program need to be easily deliverable without major right-of-way issues or complex environmental studies. The recommendations for this report are for funding infrastructure construction.
- C. The candidate location was taken from the 2010 Transportation Programming Guide (TPG). It is the highest ranking location that best meets the published grant funding objectives.

#### **BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to submit an application for the Federal Safe Routes to Schools Grant Program for a new traffic signal at Rio Linda Boulevard and Acacia Avenue, and new sidewalk improvements to Acacia Avenue.
- Section 2. If this application is selected for funding, a local contribution of \$100,000 will be provided from the Pedestrian Improvement Program (T15100400) to reimburse project development costs and grant application costs prior to grant award and also to provide local matching funds.
- Section 3. Exhibit A is incorporated into and made part of this Resolution.


