SUBJECT: Follow-up Report on Traffic Control Devices--William Land Park

SUMMARY

This report provides a response to a Council request for additional information concerning the installation of traffic control gates in William Land Park. Additionally, an alternative source of funds for this project is identified.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On March 3, 1981, the City Council received companion staff reports concerning the need for additional parking restrictions and traffic control devices in William Land Park. The Council approved the parking restrictions which affected several streets in the Park interior and private residences on 11th and 13th Avenues.

Further, the City Council approved an intent to install traffic control devices following a public hearing to be scheduled at least 30 days from March 3, 1981. The staff was instructed to identify a source of funds other than that included in the staff report dated February 23, 1981.

The staff scheduled a public meeting in the City Council Chambers on March 27, 1981 for the purpose of providing park users and nearby residents an opportunity to discuss the new parking restrictions and the proposed traffic control devices. Approximately 45 persons, the majority of which were nearby residents, attended the public meeting. The staff described the City's reasons for the need for the new parking restrictions and the traffic control devices and responded to questions from those in attendance. The staff agreed to a citizen suggestion to open existing gates on two segments of 18th Street to vehicular traffic. The intent of the proposal is to allow vehicular access in the interior of the Park and to provide additional parking spaces. The pilot program is scheduled for Sunday, April 5, 1981. A verbal staff review of the impact of this change will be provided at the Council meeting of April 7, 1981.


FINANCIAL DATA

The cost of construction and installation of the traffic control gates is estimated at \$10,000. The cost of materials and supplies for the parking restriction signs installed by the Traffic Engineering Division is \$2,000. The total cost of the project is \$12,000, which is available in unappropriated Park Development Funds.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council, by resolution, approve the construction of new traffic control gates in William Land Park and appropriate funds in the amount of \$12,000 to cover the cost of the project.

SUBJECT: Addition of Traffic Control Devices in William Land Park

SUMMARY

This report recommends the construction of traffic control gates in six locations within William Land Park to assist the Police Department in restricting access during certain peak hours on Sundays and holidays.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City staff, with the participation of Councilwoman Anne Rudin, has recently concluded meetings with interested citizens concerning the need to restrict parking and access in and around William Land Park on Sundays and holidays. The City staff representation included the Police Department, Traffic Engineering Division, and the Department of Community Services.

On February 12, 1981, a representative group of residents concurred with the staff recommendation to install gates at six locations within Land Park and to restrict parking on Sundays and holidays within Land Park and within residential areas immediately adjacent to the Park. The areas scheduled for traffic control gates are indicated on the attached Exhibit A and are described as follows:

1. 12th Avenue at the Riverside entrance to Land Park.
2. 13th Street at the south side of the 11th Avenue intersection.
3. 13th Avenue at the west side of the Land Park intersection.
4. 15th Avenue between the Lily Pond and the Zoo.
5. 18th Street at the south side of the 13th Avenue intersection.
6. 14th Avenue at the west side of the 19th Street intersection.

FINANCIAL DATA

The staff estimates that the cost of construction and installation of the traffic gates will be \$10,000. Additionally, the cost of materials and supplies for the installation of the parking restriction signs is estimated to be \$2,000. The total cost of the project is \$12,000, which is available in General Revenue Sharing funds from another project.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council, by resolution, approve the construction of the traffic control gates in William Land Park and the transfer of funds to cover the cost of the project.




The attached petition has been signed by the residents of over 74% of the homes on 11th Ave that face William Land Park, between Riverside Blvd & 13th Street
