**SUBJECT: Sports Commission Report-back**

**SUMMARY**

This report provides information, as requested by the Committees at their meeting of June 8, 1988, regarding the amount of City staff time to be committed to the Sacramento Sports Commission. This report is for information only.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

At its regular meeting of June 8, 1988, the Joint Budget and Finance and Transportation and Community Development Committees reviewed the final report of the Sacramento Professional Sports Task Force Commission. On the same date, the full City Council adopted an ordinance establishing the Sacramento Sports Commission to attract and promote professional franchises and major professional and amateur sporting events. The joint Committees recommended this action with the stipulation that the amount of staff time to be committed to the Sports Commission be detailed and reported to the joint Committees.

On the basis of the amount of City staff time spent on the Task Force since August, 1987, it is estimated that Parks and Community Services staff will spend approximately 16 hours quarterly on tasks such as setting the meeting(s) agenda, taking minutes, and establishing the Commission's work program. The Sacramento Sports Association, Chamber of Commerce's Council to Attract Major Professional Sports, and the Convention and Visitors' Bureau will provide an amount of staff time equal to or greater than the amount of time spent by City staff.

One of the first tasks of the Commission will be to agree upon a detailed work plan, including staffing needs. Staff will report back to the Council with the Sports Commission's detailed work plan and staffing needs following appointment of the Commission members and setting of the work plan.


