LAW AND LEGISLATION COMMITTEE

August 21, 1986

The meeting was called to order at 4:12 p.m. by Councilman and Committee Chairman Terry Kastanis. Also present was Dave Shore. Bill Smallman and Doug Pope were on vacation.

1. Opposition to A.B. 3314 (Leonard) Relating to Delayed Payment of Development Capital Improvement Fees. Erling Linggi, Assistant Director of Parks and Community Services, Roberta Larson, Administrative Assistant for Public Works, and Marty Van Duyn, Director of Planning and Development, were all present to discuss their opposition to this bill. It was stated that the League of California Cities had negotiated some amendments with the author of this bill; however, the consensus was that the bill was still unacceptable, even with the proposed amendments. Jim Jackson, City Attorney, stated that if we are to oppose this bill, we have to move fast. He stated that the City (i.e., Diane Balter, Roberta Larson, Marty Van Duyn and Erling Linggi) should go to the League of California Cities first and talk to them about the City's concerns, then go to the author of the bill.

Dave Shore moved, Terry Kastanis seconded, and it was unanimously agreed to oppose A.B. 3314, regardless of any amendments the League of California Cities may negotiate.

2. Changes in Section 5.3-11 of the Sacramento City Code Relating to Card Room Regulations. Lt. Chuck Hamilton of the Sacramento City Police Department was present to answer any questions regarding this matter.

Dave Shore moved, Terry Kastanis seconded, and it was unanimously agreed to approve the changes to Section 5.3-11 of the Sacramento City Code relating to card room regulations. This matter will now go before the full Council.

The public portion of the meeting ended at 4:22 p.m., when the Committee went into Executive Session.
