

REGULAR MEETING
SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL
February 17, 1950

The Honorable City Council met in regular session on this date at hour of 8:10 o'clock P. M. Mayor Geisreiter presiding and roll call was answered as follows: Councilmen Bahnfleth, Cooledge, Geisreiter, Hendren, Macaulay, Nielsen, Sayre, Seymour, Wood.

The City Clerk reported having furnished each member with a copy of proceedings of Regular Meeting of February 10, 1950. The minutes of Regular Meeting of February 10, 1950 and Special Meeting of February 16, 1950, were thereupon approved.

RESOLUTION NO. 25

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, BY THIS RESOLUTION, ESTABLISHES CERTAIN POLICIES WITH RESPECT TO THE USE BY POLITICAL AGENCIES OUTSIDE THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO OF A SEWAGE TREATMENT FACILITY PROPOSED TO BE BUILT BY THE CITY OF SACRAMENT. THE POLICIES HEREWITH STATED ARE INTENDED TO BE A GUIDE IN THE PREPARATION OF NECESSARY FORMAL AGREEMENTS WHICH WILL HEREAFTER BE EXECUTED BETWEEN EACH POLITICAL AGENCY AND THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO IN CONNECTION WITH THE USE OF A CITY OWNED SEWAGE TREATMENT FACILITY BY POLITICAL AGENCIES OUTSIDE THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

1. It shall be the policy of the City of Sacramento that the proposed sewage treatment plant to be built by the City of Sacramento shall be built of such size and capacity to accommodate sewage flows from political agencies outside the City of Sacramento when such agencies shall, by formal contract with the City of Sacramento, have agreed to pay for such capacities as are required for their use. The ownership of the sewage treatment facility, pipe lines, equipment, appurtenant structures, etc. shall be and shall remain in the City of Sacramento, and such contracts as may be entered into between outside agencies and the City of Sacramento shall only provide for the acceptance from outside agencies of stated quantities of sewage for processing and disposal. The contracts above referred to shall be so drawn as to protect the rights of the outside agency as well as the City of Sacramento.
2. It shall be the policy of the City Council that the taxpayer of Sacramento City and the City user of sewerage facilities shall not be required to pay any part of the cost of treatment of the sewage of any outside agency.
3. It shall be the policy of the City Council that the capital costs of the project shall be assessed equally and proportionate to their use on all agencies who may contract to use the City facility, together with the City of Sacramento itself. Depending upon the capacity each agency shall have contracted to reserve for its use, that agency shall pay its share based on unit capital costs which shall include all costs of constructing the facility. This unit capital cost, computed on the basis of each million gallons daily of plant capacity, or of line capacity, shall apply equally to each agency, including the City of Sacramento, which uses that part of the facility. The City of Sacramento reserves the right to apply only to the credit of City of Sacramento users such subventions of State moneys which are available to the City of Sacramento and are assigned by State Statute to such use.
4. It shall be the policy of the City Council that an outside agency may contract to pay for the capital costs representing the capacity it wishes to reserve by one of three (3) methods:
 - a. The outside agency may ask that the City bond issue be large enough to pay for the capacity it wishes to reserve in the treatment plant and associated facilities, providing it agrees that during the life of the bonds and at the interest rate which the bonds may bear, the agency will pay annually, or at other shorter periods, to the City of Sacramento amounts to cover the interest and retirement on said bonds.
 - b. The outside agency may ask that it be allowed to pay in cash, obtained from its own sources, for the capacity it might agree to have reserved for its use in the facility.
 - c. The outside agency may ask that it be allowed to pay part of its share in cash and that the City bond issue be large enough to cover the balance of costs which will be entailed by capacity it agrees to reserve, the bond costs to be paid for as in "a" above.
5. It shall be the policy of the City Council that the operation costs of the treatment plant shall be based on unit costs which shall apply equally to the outside agency and to the City of Sacramento in accordance with actual quantities of sewage from each agency, processed during the period on which unit costs are based, and it will be expected that each outside agency shall pay annually, or at shorter periods, for these operation costs.
6. It shall be the policy of the City Council that there shall be established an Advisory Committee, with representation on this committee of every participating agency, including the City of Sacramento. It shall be the function of this committee to review the procedures which may be followed and to make recommendations thereon. It shall also be the function of the Advisory Committee to make suggestions and recommendations concerning the management and operation of the project and to act as a coordinating committee for the consideration of problems relating to the ultimate establishment of a treatment facility for the

best interests of all agencies concerned.

7. In summary, it is stated that it is the policy of the City Council that the political agencies surrounding the City of Sacramento be given fair and equal consideration with the taxpayer and user of the City of Sacramento, thus to enable these agencies, together with the City of Sacramento, to exert the greatest possible effort to remove and prevent pollution of the Sacramento River, the American River, and the natural water supplies of the area.
