

Resolution of Intention No. 2438

Pursuant to the authority of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the "Improvement Act of 1911," approved April 7th, 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof.

It is hereby resolved that it is the intention of the City Council of the City of Sacramento to order the following street work to be done, to-wit:

The improvement of the following in the City of Sacramento:

EASTERLY ONE-HALF OF 39TH WAY, from the southerly line of "C" Street, to the northerly line of "McKinley Boulevard Tract No. 4" (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California); and SAN MIGUEL WAY, from the southerly line of "C" Street, to the northerly line of said "McKinley Boulevard Tract No. 4;" by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete curbs and gutters and concrete sidewalk; grading; constructing an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half ($5\frac{1}{2}$) inches in thickness; and installing an ornamental electric street lighting system complete with posts, tops, lamps, conduit, conductor cables, concrete foundations and other necessary equipment for the lighting thereof;

SOUTHERLY SIDE OF "C" STREET, from the easterly line of 39th Way, to the easterly boundary of "McKinley Boulevard Tract No. 5" (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California); by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; grading; constructing concrete sidewalks; and installing an ornamental electric street lighting system complete with posts, tops, lamps, conduit, conductor cables, concrete foundations and other necessary equipment for the lighting thereof;" and

Improving the RIGHT-OF-WAYS, owned by the City of Sacramento, in the City of Sacramento, along the rear of Lots 28 to 38, both inclusive; in said "McKinley Boulevard Tract No. 5;" by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; and constructing vitrified ironstone pipe sewer.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with the detailed plans therefor adopted by the City Council and now on file in the office of the City Engineer, and also in accordance with the "Standard Specifications for the Improvement of Streets and Alleys and for the

Construction of Sewers," heretofore adopted by the said City Council; excepting street lighting system, which shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications particularly adopted therefor, which plans and specifications are now on file in the office of the City Engineer.

Concrete curbs and gutters shall be in accordance with Cut No. 6 of said Standard Specifications.

Asphaltic concrete pavement shall be constructed as provided in Section 22 of said Standard Specifications; and

WHEREAS, the said City Council did, on the 4th day of April, 1941, pass a resolution determining the initial view of said City Council to be that the debt limitation would not be exceeded; and, thereafter, the City Clerk mailed notices to all parties interested, as required by law; and, thereafter, and before the date of April 11, 1941, the owners of 100% of the area of the district to be assessed returned cards stating that they do not demand the making of the investigation, as provided in Section 3 of the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931," approved June 8, 1931, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto; and, thereafter, the City Council passed its resolution determining the computation of demands for investigation, as provided in said act;

And whereas, in the opinion of said City Council said work is of more than local and ordinary public benefit, said Council hereby orders that the costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be chargeable and charged upon a district of lands, which district is hereby declared to be the district benefited by said work and improvement and which is to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof.

The exterior boundaries of said district and the extent of the territory included therein are shown upon the map of said district adopted and approved by the City Council on April 4, 1941, which map is now on file in the office of the City Engineer and to which reference is hereby made for a particular description of the boundaries of said district and of the extent of the territory included therein;

Saving and excepting from the above bounden and described district the area of all public streets, alleys, ways, boulevards, courts and avenues included therein.

Notice is hereby given that serial bonds to represent unpaid assessments and bear interest at the rate of five (5%) per cent per annum will be issued hereunder in the manner provided by the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915," the last installment of which bonds shall mature ~~fourteen~~ ^{fourteen (14)} years from the second day of July next succeeding ten (10) months from their date.

All persons objecting to said work, or to the extent of said assessment district, are required to file their objections in writing in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Sacramento, as required by law, and notice is hereby given to all persons interested that on the 2nd day of May, 1941, at 8:15 o'clock p. m., in the Council Chamber of the City Council of the City of Sacramento, in the City Hall, on "I" Street, between 9th and 10th Streets, in said City, any and all persons having any objections to the proposed work and improvement may appear before said City Council and show cause why the proposed work and improvement shall not be carried out in accordance with this Resolution.

And the City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Resolution twice in the "Sacramento Union", a daily newspaper, as required by law.



RESOLUTION No. 2438

RESOLUTION DETERMINING COMPUTATION OF
DEMANDS FOR INVESTIGATION NO. 2438

WHEREAS, after proceedings duly had and taken by Resolution of Preliminary Determination No. 2438, adopted by the City Council on April 4, 1941, under and pursuant to the provisions of Section 2 of the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931," this City Council has determined and declared its initial view to be that the contemplated improvement described in said Resolution No. 2438 is one in which the probable assessments will not exceed the limitation set up by said act; and

WHEREAS, the Clerk of this City Council has given notice of the contemplated action of this City Council in the time, form and manner provided by Section 13 of said act above referred to, and has executed and filed an affidavit showing full compliance with the provisions of Section 13; and

WHEREAS, 100% of the owners of the lands within said district have returned cards, stating that they do not demand the making of the investigation as provided in Section 3 of the said Special Assessment Investigation Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:


That the number of return postcards received in response to said notice, having been computed and tabulated, as a result thereof it is hereby found and determined that the owners of less than 15% of the total area of lands proposed to be assessed for the proposed improvement described in said Resolution No. 2438 have demanded the making of the investigation provided for under the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931."

RESOLUTION NO. 2438

Resolution Ordering Work No. 2428

Resolved, that the public interest and convenience require, and the City Council of the City of Sacramento hereby orders the following street work to be done, to-wit:

THE IMPROVEMENT OF "K" Street, from the sewer in place in 53rd Street, to a point 290 feet easterly therefrom,

in the City of Sacramento to the extent, with the materials and in the manner set forth in Resolution of Intention No. 2428, passed and adopted by said City Council on March 21, 1941 ~~1941~~, reference to which Resolution of Intention is hereby made for a description of said work and improvement, and of the district to be assessed for the costs and expenses of said work.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to post conspicuously for five (5) days on or near the Council Chamber door of the City Council notice hereof, with specifications, inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work; and to publish twice a notice hereof, inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work, and referring to the specifications posted and on file, the said publication to be in the "Sacramento Union," a daily newspaper published and circulated in said City of Sacramento and hereby designated for that purpose.

All such proposals or bids shall be received by the City Clerk, at his office in the City Hall of said City, on the 25th day of April, 1941 ~~1941~~, between the hour of 4:00 o'clock p. m., and the hour of 5:00 o'clock p. m., and said day is hereby designated as the day on which at the hour of 8:15 o'clock p. m., the said proposals or bids shall be opened, all of which shall be specified in said notice, and said notice shall require with said proposals or bids a check certified by a responsible bank, payable to the City of Sacramento, for an amount not less than ten per cent (10%) of the aggregate of the proposal, or by a bond for the said amount, and so payable, signed by the bidder and two sureties, all as prescribed by law.
