Councilman Murphy arrived at this time.

This having been the date set for hearing on the Transient Occupancy Tax Ordinance, consideration was had at this time.

Councilman Christensen presented the following statement which was read and ordered filed:

As I reported to you last week, your Council Core Area Committee with the office of the City Attorney has reached agreement on the terms of the ordinance with Chairman Barbaria and Supervisor Wood of the County Board of Supervisors, County Executive M. D. Tarshes and the County Counsel's Office.

The ordinance follows closely the form of the uniform ordinance prepared and recommended by the League of California Cities. It imposes a four percent tax on transient room occupancies in the City (defined as being for periods of 30 days or less) and provides a method for collection and the disposition of tax proceeds into a special city fund from which the Council could appropriate for general convention center purposes as well as the administration of the tax.

While the ordinance itself would take effect 30 days after its passage, the tax imposed would take effect on April 1, 1965. This is the beginning of a quarterly collection period for the tax; it also allows time to establish the procedures and forms for collection of the tax.

Concurrently with the adoption of this ordinance, I am prepared to recommend the adoption of a policy Resolution expressing the present intention of the City Council that the restaurant and bar needs on any convention center premises constructed in the City in whole or in part from these tax funds shall be met by using catered services, and not from permanent year-round general use facilities.

Anticipating from my committee's meeting with Supervisors Barbaria and Wood, that the County Board of Supervisors is ready to consider next week the adoption of a similar ordinance to apply in the unincorporated area of the County, I urge favorable consideration of this ordinance for adoption tonight and I am prepared to so move at the conclusion of the hearing.

Councilman Christensen also presented a resolution outlining statement of policy with reference to future convention facilities together with the Transient Occupancy Tax Ordinance for Council consideration.

A telegram from Charles P. Bucaria, President of the Sacramento Junior Chamber of Commerce, in support of the proposed ordinance was read and ordered filed.

The following persons appeared and spoke in favor of the proposed ordinance: Charles E. Brown, Keith Lamb, representing the Sacramento Restaurant and Tavern Owners Association.

In addition, the following persons appeared and spoke in opposition to the proposed ordinance: Les Wright, Mrs. Javalan, Clifford Knudson, Mr. Axford, D. C. Elder and K. Orr.

Following a general discussion, Councilman Marriott moved that hearing be closed and action deferred to regular meeting of November 24, 1964. Seconded by Councilman Talkin and carried by the following vote:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento purchased Lot 42 of Elder Tract on November 16, 1960, for the proposed westerly extension Matson Drive; and

WHEREAS, the City later sold the Southerly 19.5 feet to Mr. Glaherty on October 11, 1963, for \$1,500.00 as being surplus to the City's needs; and

WHEREAS, a survey of this area revealed that the recorded map did not agree with the property lines in the field and that the City should have sold him the Southerly 13.82 feet only; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Flaherty has agreed to quit claim his original purchase back to the City and in return the City will give him a new grant deed using the corrected description.
