"An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 17, Fourth Series, passed September 22nd, 1921, and entitled, "An Ordinance defining Garbage, Rubbish and waste matter and providing for the regulations, keeping, gathering, receiving, disposing and destruction thereof; providing for the collection and disposition thereof by the City of Sacramento; fixing the fees to be paid for said service; making it unlawful to spill or throw garbage, rubbish or waste matter of any kind upon the streets, alleys, public places or vacant lots of the City of Sacramento; prescribing the hours when the burning of rubbish may be done within the limits of the City of Sacramento; making a violation of the provisions of this Ordinance a misdemeanor, and providing a penalty therefor; repealing ordinance No. 283, Third Series, passed April 5th, 1917; and making this Ordinance an emergency measure to take effect immediately, by adding a new section thereto to be designated as Section 16½."

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 1857 to establish, in accordance with an Act of the Legislature, approved June 6th, 1913, and providing for the installation, construction, maintenance by Municipalities of lighting works and other works and utilities, a lighting district in the City of Sacramento, to be known as Lighting District No. 13, to include the property fronting in 37th Street from the southerly line of J Street to the northerly line of Folsom Boulevard, and providing for the construction and installation of electroliers and an electrical conduit system in said district.

That there be installed, along the easterly and westerly sides of 37th Street, in the City of Sacramento, from the southerly line of J Street to the northerly line of Folsom Boulevard, electroliers, together with lamp, globes, conduits, connections and all equipment necessary for the lighting thereof.

Said district is bounded and described as follows:

"An Ordinance fixing the salaries of the City Engineer, City Controller, Chief of the Fire Department, Health Officer, Librarian, Superintendent of Parks, Chief of Police, Superintendent of Recreation, Assistant City Engineer, Chief Operating Engineer, Harbormaster, Office Engineer, Building Inspector, City Electrician, Assessor-Collector, Auditor, and Purchasing Agent of the City of Sacramento and repealing Ordinance No. 5, Fourth Series, passed June 30th, 1921 and Ordinance No. 112, Fourth Series, Passed March 1st, 1923."

Ordered to take usual course.

Ordinance creating a division of the Department of Engineering to be known as the Division of Architecture, heretofore introduced, was laid over one week.

Ordinance, heretofore introduced, regulating the use of flues, chimneys and smokestacks in City of Sacramento, was laid over one week.

Ordinance providing for control and eradication of rabies in City of Sacramento, heretofore introduced, was ordered laid on table.

Following Ordinance as amended November 22nd, 1923 was finally considered:

"An Ordinance regulating plumbing in the City of Sacramento; providing for the examination of and issuance of certificates of registration to qualified plumbers; prescribing the methods of plumbing installation and materials to be used and providing a penalty for the violation of this Ordinance and repealing Ordinance Number 414, Third Series, passed November 6th, 1919, and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance."

Councilman Funke moved that foregoing Ordinance be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Sullivan; discussed, Leo O'Brien, representative of journeymen plumbers, addressing Council in favor of passage, and Roll Call on adoption resulted as follows:
