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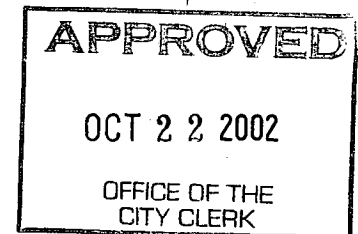

**SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF CHANGE ORDER AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL FUNDING  
FOR CRACK SEALING AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS**

**LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:** All districts.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

This report recommends that the City Council authorize the City Manager to execute a change order in the amount of \$150,000 for additional work to Bauman Landscape, Inc., d.b.a.: Northern California Crack Sealing Company, to complete this Fiscal Year (FY) Crack Sealing projects.

**SUMMARY:**

This additional funding will continue the on-going program for the preparation of city streets for annual resurfacing. The additional \$150,000 is required to complete the crack sealing on the

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identified residential streets to be sealed in FY 2002/03. The additional funding will enable us to meet our goal to have all streets in the residential seal program crack sealed prior to the beginning of the annual residential street resurfacing program in FY 2003/04.

**COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:**

None.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

City Council awarded the contract extension for crack sealing to Bauman Landscape, Inc., d.b.a. Northern California Crack Sealing on June 25, 2002. The contract extension was awarded in the amount of \$300,000 to apply 131 tons of crack seal material on streets targeted for resurfacing. The contractor provides the equipment and labor used in filling the cracks in selected streets; the city provides the material, inspection and traffic control.

This change order is required to compensate the contractor for completion of the residential areas described in the Transportation Programming Guide (TPG) planned for resurfacing in 2003/04.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

Sufficient funds to cover this change order exist in the Department of Public Works, Maintenance Services (Street Operations) operating budget (funding line: 101-310-3191-4258).

**ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

The current project has been determined to be exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under section 15301 (c) which states that repair and maintenance of existing highways and streets involving negligible or no expansion of existing use is exempt.

**POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

The action requested herein is consistent with Sacramento City Code, Title 03. This project helps to meet the City goals to "enhance and preserve the neighborhoods" and to "improve and diversify the transportation system."

**ESBD EFFORTS:**

This contract was originally awarded under the M/WBE policy, the City Manager's Office waived MBE/WBE participation for the original project. This project involves only labor and

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equipment and does not have subcontracting opportunities. The Public Works Department current ESBE participation exceeds the City's 20% goal.
