Action items:

1. Donated artworks:

Approval of donated artworks by Sachio Yamashita. All works accepted into the rotating art collection.

Two works considered for placement in the Convention Center. APP staff will meet with Convention Center Staff to review artworks and potential locations.

Approval of artworks on loan by Phil Phillippe. All artworks accepted on loan into the rotating collection.

0 noes 7 ayes.

2. Approval of Masatoyo Kishi and his proposal for Embassy Suites Hotel Fountain Project.

All approved. Also, revised budget for fountain project and arts plan was approved. Developer wishes to use standard light fixtures instead of commissioned artworks. More funds will be available for the fountain and remaining monies will be available for metal work. The developer will review proposals from three regional artists. 0 noes 7 ayes.

3. Approval of Phill Evan's proposal for Water Intake project.

All approved Phil's refined proposal for the intake project. All felt that the revised proposal and architectural redesign of the dome were more suited for the project, better integration of the sculpture with the dome structure. The sculptural elements will be made of stainless steel as well as other colored metals- copper, brass/bronze etc. All agreed that lighting would be important- dramatic effect at night. Don felt that the project would not be seen as much from the river as the previous proposal. Architect stated "that the more simplified the art elements on top of the dome the better" in his opinion. Phill will continue to work with the project team.

Gate proposal was also revised and approved. Phil will create insets for a standard gate to be provided by construction budget.

Other Business:

Garr was presented with a certificate of appreciation for his work on the APP Committee.

Update- Duke Cahill artwork. Artist Steve Vanoni made a presentation regarding the plight of Duke Cahill's artworks. The Committee decided that they were interested in seeing the site again to look at the idea of accepting some of the art works into the APP Collection.

Note: The committee met at 9 a.m. July 14, 2000 with Steve Vanoni at the Duke Cahill site. The Committee agreed to accept into the collection - 2 gate elements and two or three sculptures depending on the budget available to move and reinstall the works and the availability of locations for the artworks. Staff will report back to the committee. Steve said that the works need to be moved within three months.

APP RECEPTION AND FORUM**

PLACE: THE ARTS FOUNDRY GALLERY

PROSPECTIVE DATES: THURSDAY, August 24, 2000 or THURSDAY, September 28, 2000

OBJECTIVE: This reception is for the art community of Sacramento. The afternoon/evening event will last for 2 hours and will include a wine bar hosted by Alan Osborne, displays of previously awarded commission presentations (slides formats, slide identification sheet, resume, presentation boards or maquettes), slide show of installed works of art in the city collection, introduction and overview of the Arts in Public Places program, speeches on the process of selection panels and the role of APP, registering of arts professionals for selection panels and a question and answer period from the attendees to the APP chairman and staff. The purpose is to spur interest and participation in the various aspects of APP. These aspects include the nurturing of novice and emerging artists, bringing the more experienced Sacramento Artists in to apply for commissions or sit on selection panels and to build a rapport with the arts community at large.

SUGGESTED PROGRAM:

1. Introduction of the evening's event.
2. Brad Stark's slide presentation of selected artworks in the Arts in Public Places collection.
3. Introduction of Alice Porembski. Possible topics could include the application process, importance of slide presentation and maquettes.
4. Introduction of Burnett Miller. Subject could include the role of APP.
5. Introduction of Linda Bloom. Topic of discussion could include an overview of the current and future projects of APP, cataloging of the city collection and the registering of arts professionals for selection panels.
6. A short question and answer period from the attendees to Linda Bloom.
7. Everybody mix it up- have a few glasses of wine- listen to some music provided by Brad Stark.

BRAD STARK'S FEE: \$250.00 - \$500.00 dependent upon the length and complexity of the slide presentation.
Fee includes photographing major artworks for the presentation, providing music for the event, providing sound system and microphones.
