SUBJECT: Security Lighting at Miller Park

SUMMARY

This report recommends installation of security lighting in Miller Park at an estimated cost of \$10,000.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Recreation use of Miller Park has increased significantly this past year. A comparison of park use permits issued for this site during the period of March - August of 1980 and 1981 indicates a 29% increase in park use. The Department projects a larger increase in park use in 1982. This projection is based upon the scheduled development of a lighted softball field, increased demands for soccer and rugby use of the play field, and the expressed interest of Sacramento car clubs to utilize this site for special events and general park activities.

With this increased park use, it is necessary to provide security lighting of the park. Lighting will assist in providing a more secure area for park patrons as well as the security of existing park and boat harbor improvements.

It is proposed that security lighting be installed on the perimeter of the park (see Exhibit A). Sacramento Municipal Utility District will provide the installation and maintenance of the lights. The City would be required to provide trenching and backfilling of the project. The installation, if approved, could be completed approximately April 15, 1982.

FINANCIAL DATA

The project cost is estimated at \$10,000, which includes trenching, backfilling, and utility costs of approximately \$750 for the remainder of this fiscal year (April - June). The Administrative Contingency Fund is the recommended funding source.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council approve, by resolution, the installation of security lighting and an appropriation increase to the Department of Community Services.

3. The City FY 1981-82 Capital Improvement Program Budget is hereby amended:
  - a. by transferring \$9,250 from the Administrative Contingency Fund, budget no. 1-01-5070-0000-2720, to the Miller Park Security Lighting Project, budget no. 1-01-2240-2249-4820, for the purpose stated in paragraph 1 above.
4. The above appropriation increase is to be supported by funds available in the unappropriated balance in the Administrative Contingency Fund.
