SUBJECT: PARTNERSHIP WITH THE SACRAMENTO HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY (SHRA) TO NEGOTIATE A NEIGHBORHOOD POLICING PROGRAM IN THE FRANKLIN VILLA COMMUNITY

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:

Franklin Villa housing complex and surrounding community (Triangular shaped area bordered by Franklin Boulevard to the East, Brookfield Drive to the South, and Morrison Creek to the West). Council District 8.

RECOMMENDATION:

- Authorize the City Manager to negotiate a multi-year contract with SHRA for Franklin Villa police services.

SUMMARY:

The Police Department is requesting the authority to enter into contract negotiations with SHRA to determine the feasibility of developing and executing a multi-year agreement for police services in the Franklin Villa community. The implementation of this agreement would depend on using Universal Hiring Plan (UHP) supplemental grant funding to help offset the police officer labor costs to SHRA.

The mission of the Sacramento Police Department is to work in partnership with the Community to protect life and property; solve neighborhood problems, and enhance the quality of life in our City.

BACKGROUND:

The Police Department is proposing the negotiation of a partnership with SHRA to evaluate the feasibility of implementing a multi-year Memo of Understanding (MOU) for Franklin Villa Neighborhood Police Officers (NPO's). This agreement would provide a four-year commitment to fund NPOs in Franklin Villa. The direct labor costs of these officers would be paid through SHRA; however, UHP supplemental grant funding would be used to help offset the police officer labor costs. SHRA will provide the local funding match for any costs above the Universal Hiring Plan (UHP) supplemental grant award. The approval and acceptance of the multi-year MOU would be subject to receiving UHP supplemental funds for the Franklin Villa community. The number of NPO's placed at Franklin Villa will depend on the negotiated agreement with SHRA.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

If, as proposed by the Police Department, UHP funding can be used to help SHRA fund a multi-year police service contract, this agreement would provide NPO services to Franklin Villa for at least four years. The financial terms and conditions of this contract would depend upon the negotiated MOU with SHRA and the feasibility of implementing a long-term policing contract.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

Accepting funds from SHRA to implement a neighborhood policing program is consistent with previously adopted policy directed at citywide implementation of the community oriented policing philosophy.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:





PARTNERSHIP WITH THE SACRAMENTO HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY FOR POLICE OFFICERS.

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento desires to enter into negotiations with the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency (SHRA) to execute a contract for police officer services in the Franklin Villa Community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO THAT:

1. The City Manager of the City of Sacramento, or a designated representative, is hereby authorized to negotiate, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, an agreement with SHRA, including any future agreements, extensions, modifications or amendments thereof, to implement a neighborhood policing program. Funding for these police officers will be from the Universal Hiring Plan supplemental grant and SHRA.
