

RESOLUTION NO. 2007-264

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

May 8, 2007

APPROVING PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS AND AWARD CONTRACT FOR THE 24TH STREET AND HOGAN DRIVE TRAFFIC SIGNAL INSTALLATION PROJECT (PN: SM14)

BACKGROUND

- A. The 24th Street and Hogan Drive intersection currently does not have a traffic signal. The installation of the signal will enhance the movement of traffic and provide a safe crossing for pedestrians. Improvements will include constructing a traffic signal, reconstructing the existing curb ramps, and signing and striping.
- B. The project was advertised and bids were received on April 4, 2007. The results are summarized below:

Contractor	Bid Amount	ESBE Participation Goal 20%
Tim Paxin's Pacific Excavation, Inc	\$209,302	22.3%
R.A.H. Electrical Contractors, Inc.	\$277,781	23.0%

The engineer's estimate is \$210,000. It is recommended that the contract be awarded to Tim Paxin's Pacific Excavation, Inc.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Plans and specifications for the 24th Street and Hogan Drive Traffic Signal Installation Project (PN: SM14) are approved.
- Section 2. The construction contract is awarded to Tim Paxin's Pacific Excavation, Inc. in the amount of \$209,302.


