Title: Grant: Closed Circuit Television Project

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution** 1) authorizing the City Manager or the Chief of Police as his designee, to accept \$614,964 in FY08 Department of Homeland Security Grant funding from the California Emergency Management Agency; 2) authorizing the City Manager or designee to increase the Police Department's Grant Operating and Grant Revenue budgets by \$614,964; 3) authorizing the City Manager or designee on behalf of the City of Sacramento, to enter into agreements or memorandums of understanding, as necessary, to implement this Closed Circuit Television Project.

Description/Analysis

Issue: The California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA) has awarded the Sacramento UASI an additional \$614,964 in FY08 Department of Homeland Security funding to supplement the Sacramento UASI's FY08 Department of Homeland Security Grant award. This award is specifically designated for a closed circuit television (CCTV) project and the funds cannot be used for any other purposes. These funds will pay for cameras, necessary disk storage, monitoring stations, mobile CCTV trailers, AirCards with prepaid service, and any other items required for this project. A CCTV system will aid the Sacramento Police Department when responding to incidents, investigating crimes, and proactively managing events, and could be used by other local government agencies responding to natural or man-made disasters or other incidents and events where video of the location would prove beneficial. All grant activities associated with this award must be accomplished no later than May 31, 2011.

Policy Considerations: The Sacramento Region has previously accepted Homeland Security Grant funds to implement programs to prevent, deter, respond, and recover from both natural and man-made disasters. Regional Homeland Security funding has been previously received and approved through the following City Council Resolutions: Number 2009-459 dated, July 14, 2009; Number 2008-605 dated, September 2, 2008; Number 2007-796, dated November 6, 2007; Number 2006-684, dated September 12, 2006; Number 2005-406, dated May 31, 2005; Number 2004-855, dated November 4, 2004; and Number 2003-792, dated November 13, 2003.

Environmental Considerations: This activity is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because it does not constitute a "project" as defined in section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines, and is otherwise exempt pursuant to Sections 15321(b) (law enforcement activities) and 15601(b)(3) (no significant effect on the environment) of the CEQA Guidelines.



Rationale for Recommendation: The U.S. Department of Homeland Security awarded the Sacramento Regional Office of Homeland Security FY08 grant funding for the Sacramento UASI. This award was accepted through City Council Resolution Number 2008-605 dated September 2, 2008. On July 31, 2009 CalEMA awarded the Sacramento UASI additional grant funds to implement a closed circuit television project. This additional award will benefit the City of Sacramento by providing the Police Department with additional tools for responding to and solving crimes, responding to natural or man-made disasters, and monitoring events to ensure the safety of the public. Other City of Sacramento departments may similarly benefit by using video feeds when responding to incidents or disasters (e.g., fires, natural gas line explosions, etc.). Such uses will help ensure the safety and security of city residents, people who work, shop, or go to school within the city, and visitors. This award can only be used to fund the identified CCTV project; CalEMA will not consider alternate projects. All grant activities must be accomplished no later than May 31, 2011.

Financial Considerations: CalEMA has awarded the Sacramento UASI an additional \$614,964 to supplement its FY08 Department of Homeland Security grant award. This funding allocation will pay for 100% of program costs for implementing the CCTV program. No grant match is required to implement this project.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): Purchase of supplies and equipment will be made in accordance with the City's Emerging and Small Business Development (E/SBD) program requirements whenever possible.



GRANT FUNDING FOR CLOSED CIRCUIT TELEVISION PROJECT**BACKGROUND**

- A. The City Council has previously approved the acceptance and use of Homeland Security Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funding for Federal Fiscal Years 2003 through 2009. This funding is to implement programs to prevent, deter, respond, and recover from both natural and man-made disasters. This grant funding was approved by the following City Council Resolutions: Number 2009-459 dated, July 14, 2009; Number 2008-605 dated, September 2, 2008; Number 2007-796, dated November 6, 2007; Number 2006-684, dated September 12, 2006; Number 2005-406, dated May 31, 2005; Number 2004-855, dated November 4, 2004; and Number 2003-792, dated November 13, 2003.
- B. The California Emergency Management Agency has awarded additional FY08 Homeland Security funding to the Sacramento UASI for purchase and installation of cameras, necessary disk storage, monitoring stations, mobile CCTV trailers, AirCards with prepaid service, and any other items required for this project. This Closed Circuit Television Project will provide the Police Department additional tools for responding to and solving crimes, responding to natural or man-made disasters, and monitoring events to insure the safety of the public. Other City departments may similarly benefit by using video feeds when responding to incidents or disasters (e.g., fires, natural gas line explosions, etc.). Such uses will help insure the safety and security of City residents, people who work, shop, or go to school within the City, and visitors. This award supplements the grant funding the City Council accepted through City Council Resolution Number 2008-605 dated September 2, 2008. All grant activities must be accomplished no later than May 31, 2011.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1 The City Manager or the Chief of Police, as his designee, are individually authorized, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, to accept \$614,964 in FY08 Homeland Security funds from California's Emergency Management Agency including any extensions, amendments, or assurances, thereof, for a Closed Circuit Television Project. This homeland security grant funding shall be administered by the City of Sacramento in accordance with the terms and conditions of the grant award.

Section 2 The City Manager or designee is individually authorized to make the necessary grant revenue and expense budget adjustments to implement the \$614,964 funding award.

Section 3 The City Manager or designee is individually authorized, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, to enter into agreements or memorandums of understanding, as necessary, to implement this Closed Circuit Television Project.
